

Sam entered the chicken cooking contest held during the 12th annual Delmarva Chicken Festival, conducted this year in Sam's home town of Dover, Delaware. All who watched his experienced hand and tasted his crumb-coated chicken agreed that this young boy knows his chickens. Sam's own version of Southern Fried Chicker is given here.

Southern Fried Chicken

1 egg
2 tablespoons milk
1 tablespoon corn oil
6 parts chicken (legs and


6 parts chicken (legs a breasts)
½ teaspoon salt
Pinch of pepper

Pinch of pepper
2 cup flour
Fine dry bread crumbs
Corn Oil, for frying

Beat egg slightly with a fork; blend in milk and corn oil. Remove skin from chicken parts. Sprinkle chicken with salt and pepper. Roll in flour, then in egg mixture and finally in bread crumbs. Fry in deep hot corn oil (365°F.) turning once, until golden brown.

Sauce is Important to Skewered Foods



By JANE ASHLEY

Shrimp a la Broche is a fine choice for any informal get together. The shrimp and vegetables are marinated in a flavorful sauce, so important to all skewered foods, then cooked over coals or in a preheated broiler. Served with a tossed salad, crusty bread, and iced drink your meal is complete. The sauce is made with a piquant blending of corn oil, vinegar, garlic and hot seasonings in mild proportions. Use the same sauce, by the way, for other foods.

Shrimp A Le Broche

pound small mild onions green peppers pounds tomatoes

1 pound shrimp, fresh or

frozen to 1 pound mushrooms recipe Marinating Sauce

Peel and cook onions in salted boiling water about 10 minutes or until almost tender; drain. Remove seeds and stems from green peppers and cut into quarters or 2-inch squares. Cook in boiling water about 5 minutes or until almost tender; drain. Cut tomatoes in large wedges, halves or quarters. Clean and devein the shrimp. If frozen, defrost. If using fresh mushrooms, wash and remove stems, or cut into suitable pieces.

Place onions, peppers, to-matoes, shrimp and mushrooms in a large flat dish. Pour marinating sauce over the food and let refrigerate three to four hours. Turn occasionally. When ready to cook, remove shrimp and vegetables; drain and reserve marinade for later use. Makes about % cup sauce.

Arrange shrimp and mush-rooms on skewers alternating with tomatoes, onions and pep-pers. Leave about ¼-inch be-tween each piece. Repeat to fill skewer.

Grill over hot coals, or cook in broiler. Adjust distance at top of food to heat source to 3 inches. Turn occasionally and brush the food with the marinade to give a high glaze. Makes 4 to 6 servings.



DESPITE tightly-drawn lines and strong convictions, the current battle over an election year civil rights bill is tame compared with some historic debates on that subject in the past. Historians delving into old records report that the statesmen really got their dander up in the old

Feelings ran the highest 100 years ago, just before the war between the states. In 1860 Republican Owen Lovejoy, Congressman of Illinois, is sad to have roamed the aisles of the House chamber, crossing over to the Democratic side, pointing his finger into the faces of Southerners with threats and challenges relating to the slavery issue.

Congressman Roger A Pryor ,a Virginia member, could tack only so much. He ordered Lovejoy to get back on his own side. At that point John S. Potter. a Wisconsin Republican, rushed to Lovejoy's side, and in a moment there was a bedlam of 30 or 40 milling legislators. Order was restored without bloodshed. Later Rep. Martin Crawford of Georgia wrote of the episode:

"I never said a word, but quietly cocked my revolver in my pocket and took my position in the midst of the mob I had made up my mind to sell my blood out at the highest possible price.

Later Pryor challenged Potter to a duel, asking him to Potter choose the weapons. bowie accepted, choosing knives. Pryor called this barbarous, and both parties settled by calling each other

cowards. The Senate was less tumultuous those days. But one Senator, James Hammond of South Carolina, early in the 1860's said that "as everybody has a revolver . . . a general he other House fight in on or t with great slaughter is always possible. No two nations on earth" he continued "ever were more distinctly separate and hostile than we are here."




