The late J. T. Davis helped organize the bank in 1910 and served as director and vice-president for 40 years. Then he was named president in 1950—which office he held until his death in 1958.

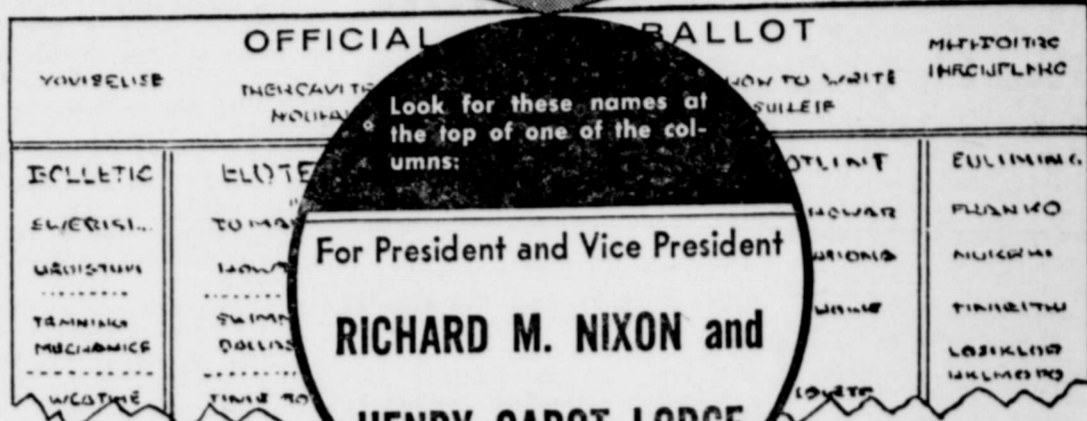

to have the building remodeled to suit the new druggist and their openings bricked up. The pharmacist's name is C. Rex McCleave and he has been running a drug store in Odessa.

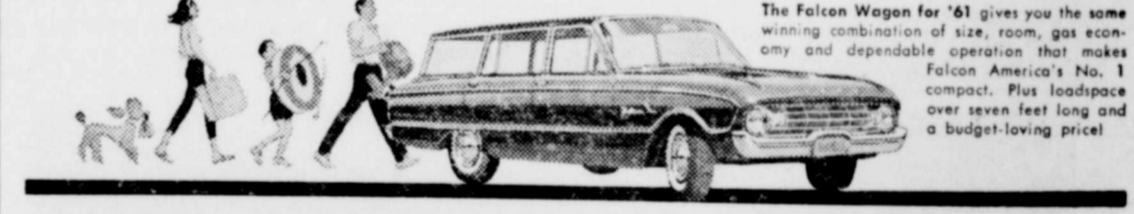

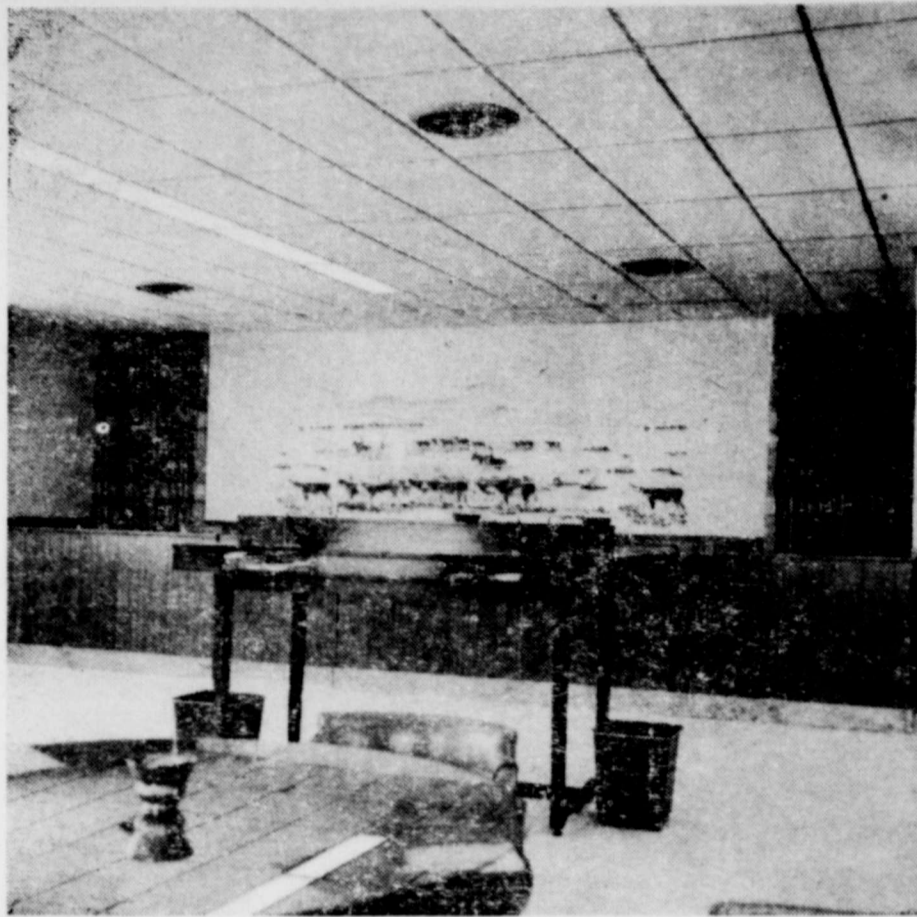
