week. The temperature fell to 14 degrees here Tuesday night MONDAY, JANUARY 30 and the whole week from Monday noon was cold, wet and disagreeable.

Better than a half inch of rain fell here during the week and more than three feet of moisture is to be found in the ground from the winter rains so far.

Water pipes froze for some residents here and icy windshields made night and early morning driving hazardous-in most of West Texas.

Cold was hard on lambing operations but the spell was not due to last too long.

The county is going into spring with the best moisture already underground in a number of years. Winter grass and weeds will be good, also.
