Soil Conservation News Column

Prior to the recent snow moisture had reached a depth of 3 1/2 inches on the deep soil range sites. With the recent snow the moisture will be much deper. With excellent moisture conditions now, we should have a very favorable year to do aerial spraying of mesquite.

Most range sites have made good improvement since the drought. Some areas are still bare or grasses are in poor vigor due to dry periods the last few years.

The moisture in the storm of the early part of the week will do much to help weed and grass growth.

**4-H Pair Win Trip to Chicago**

Top state honors for 1960 have been bestowed upon two Texas 4-H'ers, for outstanding achievements in the frozen foods and agricultural programs. They will receive trips to the 39th National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago, Nov. 27 through Dec. 1, where they will compete for \$400 scholarships.

Reba Payne, 16, of Mount Pleasant, has frozen almost 1,700 packages of foods, and estimates that she has saved \$750 during her four years with this project. She began by freezing various fruits, storing them in plastic containers, and soon expanded her project to include vegetables, poultry, meat and fish.

Yeast breads, pies, cakes, pecans, sandwiches, salads and creamed dishes were added to her freezer this year. In addition, Miss Payne experimented with the freezing of egg yolks, figs, grapes and the use of glass containers.

The 4-H frozen foods program is supported by the Whirlpool Corporation in cooperation with the Extension Service and the National 4-H Service Committee.

Pile into avocado halves. Place on salad greens. Garnish each salad with 4 asparagus tips, 2 pimiento strips, and several egg slices. Serve with remaining dressing mixture. Makes 4 servings luncheon or entrée salad.

\*Or use 2 cups canned shrimp or crayfish, drained and cut in small pieces, or 2 cups canned lobster, drained and flaked.

**Emerald Melon Salad**

MELONS are such wonderful menu helpers—and especially delightful teamed with lime-flavored gelatin for a hot weather salad. For instance, cantaloupe or honeydew melon captured in lime-flavored gelatin add a cool and colorful touch to luncheon or dinner. Try this Emerald Melon Salad with its hint of fresh mint to perk up appetites.



1 package lime-flavored gelatin; 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh mint leaves; 1 cup hot water; 1 cup cold water; 2 teaspoons lemon juice; 1½ cups melon balls or cubes\*.

Combine gelatin and mint. Add hot water and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Let stand about 15 minutes, strain, and add cold water and lemon juice. Chill until slightly thickened. Then fold in melon. Pour into 1-quart mold or individual molds. Chill until firm. Unmold. For salad, serve on crisp lettuce with mayonnaise. Makes 6 servings.

\*Cantaloupe, honeydew, and watermelon may be used.

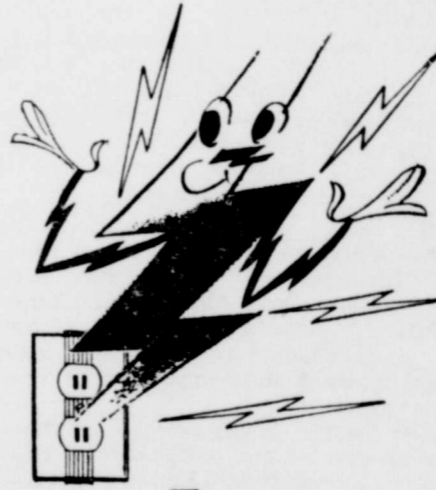

Combine egg whites, sugar, salt, water, corn syrup, and honey in top of double boiler. Beat 1 minute until thoroughly mixed. Cook over rapidly boiling water, beating constantly with sturdy egg beater (or at high speed of electric beater) 7 minutes. Remove from boiling water.
