



OLD AGE BENEFITS ARE CHANGED

One of the recent changes in the Social Security Act is important to all persons who work between the ages of 62 and 72, according to Floyd B. Ellington, Manager of the San Angelo social security office.

"This change concerns the 'earnings test' the amount one may earn and still receive some payments,' he said. "Earned income of \$1200 or less in a year has no effect on the benefits. Now, however, only \$1 in benefits is withheld for each dollar earned in excess of that amount,' he continued.

"This means that in some cases where a man and wife are both of retirement age, he can earn as much as \$3.000 a year and still recieve some old age retirement age, he can earn as much as \$3,000 a year and still receive some old age insurance. Where there are three or more beneficiaries in one worker's family, it is possible for him to earn as much as \$4,000 and receive some family payments for the same year

After age 72, there is no retirement test, Mr. Ellington believes that there are many workers in the District between age 62 72 who should apply for the benefits to avoid any possible loss. Claims may be filed with the Social Security Administration office at San Angelo, Texas.

Age Lowering for Social Security

The new social security law has lowered the retirement age for men from 65 to 62 effective with August 1961, according to Floyd B. Ellington. Manager of the San Angelo Social Security Office.

The law also provides for monthly benefits to the eligible dependents of these retired workers. These dependents include children under 18 and children over 18 who have been totally disable before that age Adopted children and stepchildren can qualify under cer-tain conditions. The workers wife can also qualify for monthly insurance benefits if she is age 62 or older, or if she has children in her care who are entitled to receive benefits, Ellington sald.

Although the male worker who applies for payments beore age 65 receives a reduced amount, his dependents get the same monthly insurance benefits that they would receive if he were 65.




