 OPTION TESTIMONY

In court all lawyers ask all witnesses except expert witnesses to report their observations, not opinions. It is for the judge and the jury—not the fact witnesses—to make inferences as to guilt or liability from the facts.

On the other hand, only "experts" can give the court their opinions. Aren't most people expert in some things? Most people are qualified to give opinions on such everyday things as speed, time, sound, and th like. Sometimes where impressions are hard to describe, a witness may have to talk in terms of opinions about such things as the force of a blow distance of a sound, the amount of light, the degree of cold or heat, weight, size, health, temper, fear and the like.

We can express the opinion that Jones "looks like the man" who did a crime, or that his footfalls or his voice were those of Jones. Courts will admit such evidence. So too, one can testify about his friends' sanity or handwriting and sometimes your own motives.

But most often the court must rely on certain skilled persons like physicians or engineers for "expert opinions" especially in complex or technical cases.

Problems in using experts: They may not agree. They may give opinions on the "ultimate" fact which the jury itself must decide (the extent of injuries, who is the father, what caused the explosion.)

Do the experts here invade the jury's province?

As a rule, no. Before a court will let the expert testify he must show his special knowledge, say, in science, art or trade. Even so, the judge and jury decide issues of the trial, not the experts alone.

Navy Now Accepting Three Year Enlistments

The Navy will accept volunteers for the first year term enlistment and will permit certain young men to reenlist for two or three years in an experimental program, Vice Admiral William R. Smedberg, III, Chief of Naval Personnel announced today.

The experimental program has been placed in operation, Admiral Smedberg said, to meet the increased readiness posture of the Navy and the Nation. It will remain in effect until June 30th, 1962. The three year enlistment program is open to men who have had no prior military training. Under the reenlistment program, eligible personnel who have been released from active duty may reenlist with an option of up to 30 days advance leave. Formerly, broken service men reenlisted for four or six years with no advanced leave authorized. Admiral Smedberg said this new experimental program would afford young men of the country an opportunity to train and serve patriotically while learning of Navy life with only a three year commitment.

The experimental program will in no way effect the Navy's current stay in school policy, young men will continue to be encouraged to stay in school.

Dr. Salk Coins A Word: Bionauts

"Super stars" of science will make up the research team of the Salk Institute for Biological Studies.

Dr. Jonas Salk, who will direct the Institute at San Diego, Calif., quite often draws analogies between sports and science.

He once said, modestly referring to his historic role in developing the polio vaccine, that "I just happened to be in the right place to catch a long forward pass."

Today he might select another sport and say that the Institute faculty members are the Mickey Mantles of science—they can hit home runs from either side of the plate. Dr. Salk points out that in recruiting his Institute Fellows he searched for and found versatile scientists "who have all been trained in a field other than that in which they are working today."

Varied Abilities

They possess more than one skill or field of knowledge. They are not limited to biology. Some of the 10 Fellows already appointed are equally at home in higher mathematics and physics, or history and literature.

This unique combination of professional skills, versatility, imagination and intellectual curiosity has been described by many as the magic formula needed today to achieve the conquest of disease—from the common cold to cancer. They believe firmly that an assault on disease of the kind and magnitude planned by Dr. Salk and his colleagues could pave the way to revolutionary breakthroughs.

Just as the Mickey Mantles depend on the baseball fans who pay their way through the turnstiles, construction of the Salk Institute will depend on contributions from the general public.

\$15 Million Goal

This summer all across the nation a campaign is in full swing to raise \$15,000,000 to build and equip the Institute. The drive is sponsored by The National Foundation through the March of Dimes. It is a renewal of the partnership between all Americans and Dr. Salk—the man who did so much for them in developing the polio vaccine, and will do so much more as director of the Institute.

As another way of describing the scientists who will work at

the Institute, Dr. Salk has coined the word "bionauts." "If we can speak of astronauts," he asks, "why can't we think of 'bionauts'—scientists who are capable of doing in biology what has now been done in the fields of space and of atomic physics?" He envisages the Salk Institute as a sort of launching pad for the gifted "bionauts" of the scientific world who will comprise his faculty.

The conditions under which the Salk Institute "bionauts" will pursue their studies are probably unique. The physical as well as the intellectual atmosphere of the Institute has been designed so that the individual scientist can concentrate fully on productive work and thought. Laboratory equipment will of course be the most modern. A highly specialized reference library on biology and related fields will be maintained. The whole environment is designed to spur the Institute Fellow toward daring and uninhibited original thinking on how to reach the goal he is seeking—faster.

Pioneering Projects

In most great universities and other research centers scientists are obliged to invest a great deal of their time in teaching and in administrative detail. There will be none of these time-consuming duties for the faculty of the Salk Institute. Its members will spend all of their time on pioneering projects. Moreover, they will have complete freedom to launch whatever projects they elect and may change the direction of their research if they wish.

Experts familiar with the scientific world and its leaders agree that the 10 Fellows se-

lected thus far are entering the stage of their most productive period. Their average age is 49 years but seven of the 10 are even younger.

Dr. Warren Weaver, vice president of the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation and a Salk Institute Nonresident Fellow who is often described as the "elder statesman of American medical research," is 67; but Dr. Melvin Cohn, a famed American biochemist now with the Pasteur Institute of Paris, and a Salk Institute Resident Fellow, is only 38.

A-Bomb Architect

Dr. Leo Szilard, long-time professor of biophysics at the University of Chicago and celebrated worldwide as one of the "architects of the atomic bomb," a Nonresident Fellow, is 63. But Dr. Edwin Lennox, an American microbiologist now also on leave at the Pasteur Institute, and a Resident Fellow, is only 41.

Dr. Jacob Bronowski, of London, a Resident Fellow who is well known in the United States for his books and lectures, is 54. His versatility is outstanding—in mathematics, philosophy and history.

Dr. Salk has remarked that the professional and cultural interests of the Fellows happily overlap. At a recent meeting of several of these scientists in New York City, they chatted with vivacity of organizing competing string quartets at the Salk Institute next year, of sailing and swimming in the Pacific, even of shooting a round of golf now and then. These "super stars" of science who may be expected soon to revolutionize biology and thus "help man make the most of his gift of life" are human beings, too.

Civil Service Examination

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced a new examination for Transmitter and Receiver Operator and Maintenance Technician for filling positions in field locations of the U.S. Information Agency's Voice of America program. The positions to be filled pay from \$3.05 to \$4.49 an hour and are located at Greenville, North Carolina and Honolulu, Hawaii. In filling the positions in Honolulu, preference in certification will be given to persons living in Hawaii.

The Voice of America broadcast operations are on a 24-hour, 7-day week basis. Assignments to these positions will be made to an 8-hour, 5-day shift based upon a flexible schedule subject to change. Shift assignments are made in accordance with broadcasting schedules.

To qualify, applicants must have had responsible experience in the operation and maintenance of broadcasting and receiving equipment which demonstrates a thorough knowledge of radio transmitter operations. Full details concerning requirements to be met are given in Announcement No. 283 B.

Applications will be accepted until further notice and must be filed with the Executive Secretary, Board of U.S. Civil Service Examiners, U.S. Information Agency, Room 2738 Tempo R Building, Washington 25, D.C.

AROUND THE COUNTY



ARTHUR BARLEMANN, JR. COUNTY AGENT

Last week while attending the National Meeting of the National County Agricultural Agents Association in Las Cruces, New Mexico, we had the pleasure of visiting several spots of interest in the area. The meeting was held on the campus of New Mexico State University, the land grant college of New Mexico. This year marked the one hundredth anniversary of all land grant colleges in the United States. It was also the fiftieth anniversary of New Mexico's joining the United States as the 47th state. In addition, it was the 47th annual meeting of the County Agents' Association. And 1961 persons registered—one more would have made more coincidences.

On Sunday afternoon, the 26th, about half of the group took advantage of the opportunity to travel to Juarez, Mexico to take in the bull-fights there. After the first fight, many announced they had seen two fights—their first and last—and that was all they intended to see, they were going back to the USA.

On Tuesday afternoon, the entire group were guests of the army at the White Sands Missile Range, the birthplace of the United States entry into the missile race. We were shown all the missiles now in use. In addition, we saw an afternoon firing of the Honest John, an unguided rocket used by the artillery. Tuesday night we saw the firing of the most powerful rocket the United States has in its arsenal at this time, the Nike Zeus. It is the only anti-Intercontinental Ballistic Missile in the free world today—the only missile capable of shooting down another missile.

Tuesday night, the group was guests at a barbecue in the White Sands National Park. The famous Koshare Indian dancers, a Boy Scout troop from La Junta, Colorado entertained with their dances.

On Wednesday, the group toured the Stahman Farms near Las Cruces. This is the world's largest pecan grove. There are over 100,000 pecan trees on over 4000 acres of irrigated Rio Grande Valley land. These trees produce between 3 and 4 million pounds of pecans a year in the better years. This year they expect to produce this amount—last year the crop was short, and the year before it was exceptionally high.

The trees are planted 30 feet apart on 60 foot borders. Between the two rows of trees in each border, two rows of long staple cotton are planted to make further use of the land and water. Geese are used to weed the cotton and are another product of the farms.

Each year, over 200,000 geese are dressed and marketed at 16 weeks of age. A processing plant is located on the farm and was one of the sites visited. In addition to the geese, several carloads of feathers and down are marketed annually.

Over 125,000 laying hens are in production now. The eggs are candled, graded, and packed and flown to the New York market. Just a few days before our arrival, a house with 8,000 hens had burned with a total loss of all 8,000 hens.

In addition to the goose packing plant, they operate two pecan cracking and packaging plants and a feed mill.

The remainder of the time was spent in meetings of the association. A Texas County Agent, Elmo Cook of Austin was elected vice president of the association for 1963. Elmo was born and reared in Mitchell county. He has been a county agent for 33 years, 14 years of it in Austin.

The meeting was most enjoyable. Association with agents and their families from all over the nation is enjoyed

by all and the discussions bring out the different problems in different areas. Only three states were not represented, Maine, Alaska and California. Ten agents from Hawaii were present. Missouri led with 113 present, New Mexico with 110, Illinois with 109, and Texas with 107 present were the biggest groups.

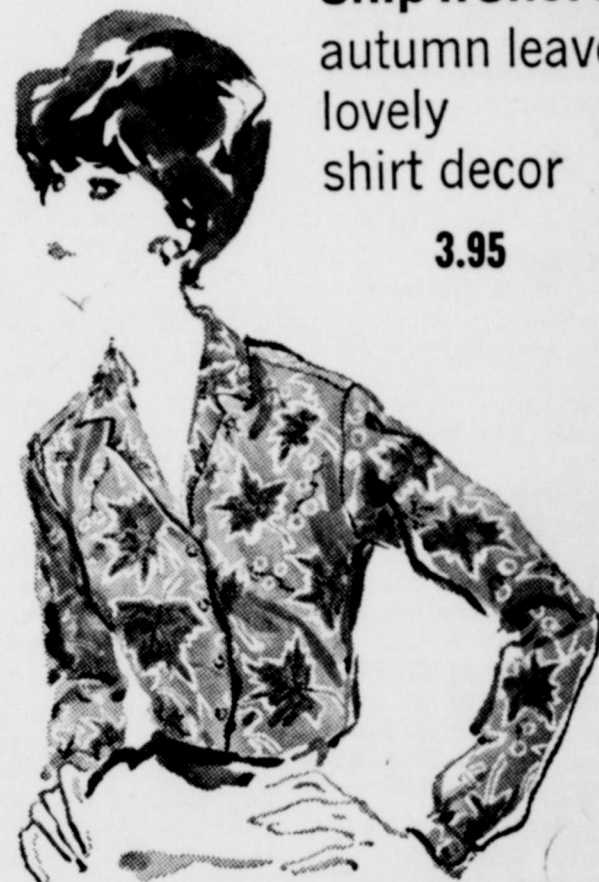

The form above may be clipped from the paper, filled out and presented to the doctors or nurses at the time the vaccine is received. By having the form already filled out, a juvenile can receive his vaccine within the shortest possible time. His parent or guardian must sign the request form, and the signature must be witnessed by two persons. The witness may be any adults, including relatives. If a form is not filed out for a juvenile when he arrives to take his vaccine, it will require waiting in line. Request forms will be available at the vaccine stations.
