

#### Quick Roast Chicken Stuffing



Dinner parties present a true test of a homemaker's table-setting arrangement as well as her culinary skill. The food served must measure up to the table finery, hopefully without chaining the hostess to the kitchen. Modern convenience foods such as instant whipped potatoes and Brandywine canned sliced white button mushrooms help the modern hostess to short-cut dinner preparation. The Borden Kitchen shows how this can be accomplished in this recipe for a roast chicken stuffing:

#### Instant Whipped Potato Stuffing (Makes enough stuffing for one bird)

- 1 (4 to 41/2-lb.) roasting
- chicken 4 tablespoons butter 2 medium-size onions,
- chopped 3 (4-oz.) cans sliced button mushrooms, drained well
- 1 teaspoor salt 1/4 cup milk
- 11/2 cups (4 servings) instant whipped potato flakes
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper 1/8 teaspoon poultry seasoning

% cup mushroom liquor Clean and truss bird; salt the inside. Melt butter in small skillet; saute onions and mushrooms in butter until onions are tender and slightly transparent. Pour mushroom liquor and salt into small saucepan. Cover and bring to a boil. Remove from heat and add milk immediately. Add potato flakes. Stir with a fork until all moisture is absorbed. Whip briskly. Add sauteed vegetables, pepper and poultry seasoning and mix well. Cool slightly. Lightly stuff bird with dressing and close cavity. Cover bird with clean cheese cloth which has been dipped in melted butter. Boast breast side down on rack in an open roaster in butter. Roast, breast side down, on rack, in an open roaster in slow oven (325°F.) about 1¼ hours or until tender. Remove cloth, turn bird breast side up and continue to roast 15 minutes longer. If desired, garnish with small bunches of green Thompson grapes, spiced red peaches, green minted pears . . . and parsley.

#### For Social Security

Over fifty million people have worked long enough under social security to qualify for cash disability benefits if they become disabled. This means that they have social ecurity credits for five years ten years, Floyd B. Ellington, district manager of the San Angelo Social Secuirty office said. In the case of a severe disability, the worker and his dependents may be eligible for monthly cash social security disability benefits if he meets this work requirement.

#### Tailor Biscuits To Your Taste



Hot breads and biscuits, tailored to your taste, are yours for the making with the help of a package of plain or buttermilk refrigerated biscuits. Salt sticks too, are easily made and are an extra-special treat. Here are several variations recommended for use with Borden's biscuits:

Biscuit Salt Sticks (Makes 10)

1 (8-oz.) package biscuits 2 tablespoons butter, melted Coarse salt Caraway seeds

Wrap a 3 x 5-inch strip of aluminum foil around the handle of a wooden spoon. Roll each biscuit between hand, stretching to a rope 10-inches long; wrap dough around the aluminum foil. Slip foil off the spoon handle onto a baking sheet. Repeat for each biscuit. Brush biscuits with butter; sprinkle with salt and caraway seeds. Bake in very hot oven (450°F.) about 12 minutes or until browned. Remove from oven. Twist ends of aluminum foil in opposite directions; carefully slip biscuits from fail in opposite directions; carefully slip biscuits from foil.

Bacon Biscuits (Makes 10)

1 (8-oz.) package biscuits 2 to 3 slices uncooked bacon, finely cut

Press each biscuit between thumb and finger to about 21/2-inch diameter; shape a slight rim around edge. Place on baking sheet. sprinkle with bacon. Bake in very hot oven (450°F.) about 12 minutes or until biscuits are browned and bacon is crisp.

Poppy Seed Biscuit Knots (Makes 10)

1 (8-oz.) package biscuits 2 tablespoons butter, melted Poppy seeds

Roll each biscuit between hands stretching to a rope about 3-inches in length. Shape dough into a loop; pull one end of dough partly through the center. Place on baking sheet. Brush biscuits with butter; sprinkle with poppy seeds. Bake in very hot oven (450°F.) about 12 minutes or until browned.
