



Blend together zwieback crumbs, 1/2 cup of sugar, cinnamon, salt and butter; press mixture against bottom and sides of 9 or 10-inch spring form pan. Bake in hot oven (400°F.) 8 to 10 minutes. Mash cheese with fork; add to egg yolks; beat well with rotary beater. Blend in cream. Stir in potato starch, juice and rind. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Gently fold into mixture. Pour into pan. Put in cold oven; set oven to slow (325°F.). Bake 1 hour, or until set. Turn off heat; open door; let stand in oven 15 minutes until slightly cool. Spread with preserves. Remove rim of pan; place with bottom tin intact on serving plate. Refrigerate until cold.

For Social Security

Over fifty million people have worked long enough under social security to qualify for cash disability benefits if they become disabled. This means that they have social security credits for five years 20 quarters) out of the past ten years, Floyd B. Ellington, listrict manager of the San Angelo Social Secuirty office said. In the case of a severe lisability, the worker and his dependents may be eligible for monthly cash social securty disability benefits if he meets this work requirement.

It is not necessary to be completely helpless to qualfy for social security disability benefits. These benefits are payable to those who suffer from a crippling disease or a severe impairment which makes them unable to do any substantial work.

Disabled adult sons and laughters of retired, deceased, or disabled workers may also eceive childhood disability benefits if they become disabled before they reached age

Anyone suffering a severe disability which prevents him from doing any substantial work should get in touch with the local social security office to determine his eligibility under the Social Security disability program, Ellington stated. He may be losing benefits if he fails to apply for them promptly. The social security district office will explain to lisabled workers and their 10,000.00 families their rights under the


