A major advance in early detection of one of the hidden causes of severe mental retardation is fast proving its worth, thanks to the "help" of thousands of newborn babies.

These children are among the first to benefit from a new, nationwide screening program for early detection of PKU (phenylketonuria), an in-herited error in body chemistry which causes severe mental retardation unless treated in

The screening program started in recent months, will eventually include some 600,-000 newborn babies in the United States. Already 157,000 newborns have undergone the simple test which was devised by Dr. Robert Guthrie of Chil-dren's Hospital, Buffalo, N. Y., with the help of a grant from The National Foundation-March of Dimes.

Without the blood test, no one might have realized until too late that an infant had PKU. Such babies seem normal at birth and for several months

thereafter. But they lack a liver enzyme But they lack a liver enzyme which enables the system to process an essential nutrient found in all protein foods. Within a day or two after the PKU infant's first milk feeding, the nutrient, called phenylalanine, begins to build up in his system. If the accumulation is not checked by special diet, and the process an essential nutrient by Sheila M. Kuhn, lab technician. 



It cooks just as well in an electric skillet or on top of the stove.

Toss a salad of greens . . . pass crusty rolls . . . bake frozen individual apple pies for dessert.

Steak Paprika

- 2 tablespoons flour ½ teaspoon paprika ¼ teaspoon leaf thyme Dash pepper 1½ pounds round steak
- 1 clove garlic, minced 1 can (10¾ ounces) condensed cream of vegetable soup ½ soup can water ½ cup sour cream

medium onion, sliced

Combine flour, paprika, thyme, and pepper; pound into meat with meat hammer or edge of heavy saucer. Cut into 6 pieces. In skillet, brown meat, onion, and garlic in shortening. Blend soup and water; pour over meat. Cover; simmer about 1½ hours, or until meat is tender. Spoon sauce over meat now and then. Remove meat from skillet. Stir sour cream into sauce; heat for a few minutes. Pour over meat; sprinkle with additional paprika, if desired. Makes 6 servings.

NOTE: In electric skillet, brown meat at 400°F. and simmer at 220°F.



All hunters are being urged to report screwworm infested deer to the land owner. This will help greatly if they will tell the owner since he may not know it. He can check his livestock a little closer and prevent outbreaks at this time which could be the source of trouble next spring.

Don't forget that the marketing year for the wool incentive payment program has been changed. The 1963 marketing year will be shorter than previous years due to the fact that the last vote approved a change. This year, the marketing year has been placed on a calendar basis and will end December 31. All receipts slips for unshorn lambs and wool must be filed in the County ASCS by the end of January.

The incentive price for 1964 wool and mohair has been set. It is 62 cents on wool and 72 cents per pound on mohair.

In 1961, Texas wool producers received a total of \$10,--094,527.54 in payments. Sterling County producers received a total of \$173,921.17 in that year. There were 83 ap-875,642 pounds of wool.
