Social Security

"Area residents should file their social security claims before they retire in order to insure prompt payment of benefits," Floyd B. Ellington, social security district manager in San Angelo, said today.

Many people of retirement age do not get their first social security checks as early as they might, simply because they waited too long to apply for their benefits, Ellington pointed out.

Applications may be filed any time within three months of when a person wants benefits to start. Since the average processing time of a claim is 4weeks, Ellington advisted people to take advantage of this early filing and submit their applications as soon as pos-

Many claims are delayed because the applicants do not IPTA tion or papers to establish their eligibility for benefits, he said. These delays could be avoided if people would get in touch with social security office ahead of time to find out what they should bring with them when they apply for benefits.




Fabled Lands Join U.N.

Zanzibar and Kenya, both former British East Africa territories, joined the world organization after attaining independence last month. Their entry raises U.N. membership to 113 countries.


