**Social Security**

"Area residents should file their social security claims before they retire in order to insure prompt payment of benefits," Floyd B. Ellington, social security district manager in San Angelo, said today. Many people of retirement age do not get their first social security checks as early as they might, simply because they waited too long to apply for their benefits, Ellington pointed out.

Applications may be filed any time within three months of when a person wants benefits to start. Since the average processing time of a claim is 4 weeks, Ellington advised people to take advantage of this early filing and submit their applications as soon as possible.

Many claims are delayed because the applicants do not have the necessary information or papers to establish their eligibility for benefits, he said. These delays could be avoided if people would get in touch with social security office ahead of time to find out what they should bring with them when they apply for benefits.

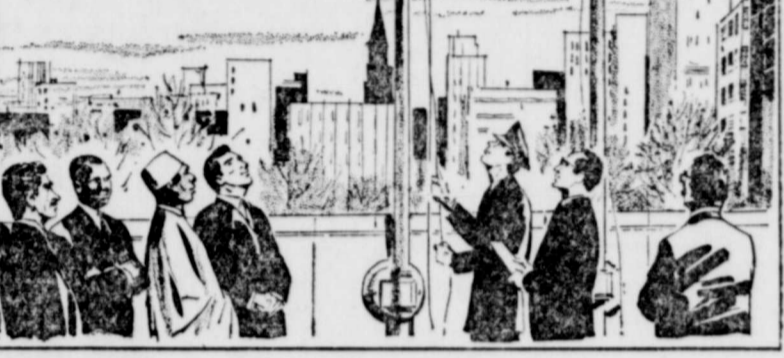
### What in the WORLD by TED

#### Fabled Lands Join U.N.

Now that Zanzibar has been admitted, the United Nations membership alphabet runs from A to Z for the first time. Zanzibar and Kenya, both former British East Africa territories, joined the world organization after attaining independence last month. Their entry raises U.N. membership to 113 countries.

Originally settled by the mainland Bantus, the coral islands of Zanzibar were ruled by the Persians in the 10th Century, and later by the Portuguese and Arabs. From 1890 until independence, Zanzibar was a British protectorate under a sultan. Its clove forests yield 80 percent of the world's supply of the familiar kitchen spice.

Kenya is a Texas-sized land of balmy Indian Ocean beaches, sun-blasted deserts, glazier-topped mountains and fertile valleys, straddling the Equator. Its rich wildlife has long made

### UCRA Directors Honor Past Chairman

The directors of the Upper Colorado River Authority in a meeting Tuesday night at the River Club in San Angelo honored the immediate past chairman, L. T. Youngblood of Bronte at a dinner party. Mr. Youngblood had served as chairman of the UCRA for many years and has been on the board since its creation in the mid thirties. He was presented with a resolution of commendation from the board and a plaque. The presentation of the plaque was made by Senator Dorsey Hardeman and the resolution was read by chairman Gerald C. Allen of Robert Lee.

Paying tribute to Mr. Youngblood were M. D. Bryant, the former mayor of San Angelo, Forrest Harding, state representative of San Angelo and Houston Harte, publisher of the San Angelo Standard.

Present at the dinner meeting were those already mentioned and Grady Mitcham, Frank Cannon, Porter Henderson and UCRA board of directors J. V. Phillips, Dick Salmon, and Dale Leddy of San Angelo, E. V. Grindstaff, Jr. of Ballinger, Henry Teplichek of Rowena, and Cumbie Ivy of Robert Lee and Jack Douthitt of Sterling City.

In the board meeting that preceded the dinner the directors approved adding about \$80,000 of improvements to the Bronte water system and \$6,000 improvements to the Carlsbad water system.

The authority has been receiving tax remissions from Coke and Tom Green County for 20 years (but ended at the end of 1963) and the money has built the city water systems for Robert Lee, Bronte, Christoval, and Carlsbad; and the authority controls the sale of water from another of its assets—the North Concho Reservoir (Lake).

The board is now having an engineering firm do some preliminary work on locating a large dam on the Colorado River.

### Dessert Charmer

THIS glamorous and refreshing treat is a perfect ending for a hearty family meal. A breeze to prepare with orange-pineapple flavor gelatin, it's a light and delicate dessert you can count on to brighten winter menus.



Orange-Pineapple Bavarian

1 can (1 pound) crushed pineapple; 1 package (3 ounces) orange-pineapple flavor gelatin; ¼ teaspoon salt; 1 cup boiling water; 1 cup heavy cream; 3 tablespoons sugar.  
Drain pineapple, measuring juice. (Add enough water to juice to equal 1 cup, if necessary.) Set pineapple aside. Dissolve gelatin and salt in boiling water. Add pineapple juice and chill until slightly thickened. Whip the cream; fold into gelatin. Combine drained pineapple and sugar; fold into gelatin mixture. Spoon into a 1-quart mold or dessert dishes. Chill until firm. Unmold. Garnish with orange sections or California walnuts, if desired. Makes 4½ cups, or 8 servings.
