

FUTURE MINING operations on the moon may have caught the public's fancy but it is the ocean that will yield the greater value, according to a report at the International Mineral Processing Congress in New York City. It is predicted that such minerals as manganese and cobalt will be mined from the sea. Social Security Tips

Will your social security monthly retirement check be \$100 or \$120? If your wife claims her payments when she's 62, will they increase when she reaches 65? These are some of the question you might like to have answered before you retire. Floyd B. Ellington, District Manager of the office in San Angelo said it's a good idea to visit their office about three months before that date. There is an advantage of your applying well ahead of time. Most applications go through without any trouble, but every once in a while someone has trouble proving his age or providing some other form of needed evidence. When that happens everything grinds to a stop until a satisfactory age or birth record or othe proof is supplied. If you wait until you retire to make your claim, and you don't have the records you need, your first check may be delayed. If you don't need your social security right away, it won't matter, but most folks count on that first check as part of their post-retirement budget.

When you visit the social security office three months before retirement, there are some records you'll need to take. The best way to find out what you should take is to phone ahead. In addition to a record of your age, you may need to taken your last withholding tax statement. If your wife is 62 and wants to apply for benefits also, she'll need a record of her age. If you call the social security office before you pay the pre-retirement visit, they can tell you exactly what you'll need. If there's some record you don't have, they can usually help you get it. Helping people with retirement claims is their business. For example, they know the best, and quickest way to get a record of your age.

Some people delay a trip to the social security office because they think a social security claim will be a lot of trouble. It isn't an automatic thing, but highly trained people will do everything to help you. There are three things to remember. First, plan ahead for your retirement. Second, call the social security office. Find out what to take with you, and the best time to go. Third don't wait until after you retire to make your social security claim. The San Angelo office is located at 3000 W. Harris, phone 949-4608.

Floyd B. Ellington, district manager of social security in San Angelo, issued a reminder today to all persons who are receiving social security benefits that they must notify the Social Security Administration whenever something happens that might affect the payment of their benefits. Some of the events which must be report-

1. Earnings from all types of work if the beneficiary is under age 72 and expects to earn more than \$1200 during the year.

2. Death of a beneficiary. 3. Change in martial status-unless the beneficiary is receiving payments as a retired worker.

4. Change of custody of a child or other person for whom you are receiving benefits.

5. Change in address. "Social security beneficiaries received a list of these and other events that must be reported with this check earlier this year," Ellington said. "If they do not have this list, they may pick up another at the social security office.

"In fact, anyone who has a question about social securty should get in touch with us to get correct information."



Grapes Are Great _ By Betty Barclay

THE term "sour grapes" has no place in a modern jelly maker's



grapes make the best jelly when today's pectin recipes are used. This Grape Jelly recipe requires a short one-minute

boil, so none of the great flavor of fresh grapes can evaporate in steam

Grape Jelly Yield: about 12 medium (8-oz.)

5 cups juice (about 31/2 lbs. ripe grapes); 7 cups sugar; 1 box (1% oz.) Sure-Jell Fruit Pectin.

First, prepare the juice. Stem about 3½ pounds fully ripe grapes and crush thoroughly. (Concord grapes give best color and flavor.) Add 1½ cups water; bring to a boil, and simmer, covered, 10 minutes. Place in jelly cloth or bag and squeeze out

juice. Measure 5 cups juice into a

very large saucepan.

Then make the jelly. Measure sugar and set aside. Add pectin to juice in saucepan and mix well. Place over high heat and stir until mixture comes to a hard boil. At once stir in sugar. Bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard I minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat, skim off foam with metal spoon, and pour quickly into glasses. Cover jelly at once with 1/8 inch hot


