





"You don't have to retire completely to get social security benefits," Floyd B. Ellington, social security district

"If you earn \$1200 or less in be completely retired and would be entitled to all your benefits," he added.

If you earn over \$1200 in a year, you may be considered partly retired and entitled to RECORD established in 1899 part of your social security benefits. For example, a worker would have only one dollar in benefits withheld for every two dollars earned between \$1200 and \$1700. For earnings over \$1700 annually, one dollar in benefits is withheld for each dollar of earnings.


