NEW CIVIL SERVICE

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced two new examinations this week, for Technician and Social Worker.

The Engineering and Scientific Technician examination covers a wide range of positions principally in the Washington, D. C. area These technicians act as non-professional assistants to engineers, mathematicians, and other scientists such as chemists, physicists, astronome.rs, geologists, metallurgists, electronic scientists, and the like The salary ranges from \$4,480 to \$10,250 a year. Varying amounts of non-professional technician experience are required, increasing with the grade of position. Study in college or technical inst tutes can be substituted for some experience.

The new Social Worker examination covers professional social worker positions and related positions known as Social Work Associate and Social Service Representative for work in Washington, D. C. and throughout the country. Salaries range from \$6,050 to \$16,460 for Social Worker and \$6,630 to \$10,250 for the other positions. Professional Social Workers are required to have completed graduate study in Social Work with professional experience in addition for the higher grades. The Associate education may be substituted for some of the needed required experience.

Announcements and appropriate application forms may be obtained from most post offices located throughout the country or from the U.S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C. 20415.

The month of January has been set for the address reporting period. All aliens in the United States, with few exceptions, must report their addresses to the Government during that period.

Mr Holland said that forms with which to make the report will be available to all Post Offices and Offices of the Immigration and Naturalization Service during the month of January.

He urges all aliens to comply with the reporting requirements, as willful failure to do so may lead to serious consequences



Social Security

APPLY FOR MEDICARE

The 1965 Amendments es tablished a Medicare program for all persons 65 or over which will help pay both hospital and doctor bills. However, this is not automatic and the individual must apply for it unless he is already receiving Social Security benefits or Railroad Retirement benefits. If he is an Old-Age Assistance recipient the welfare department will supply him with an application form.

Everyone else should come to the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harris in San Angelo and make application for the Medicare program benefits. We are open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 4:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. We have been open on Saturday mornings for the past several weeks but next Saturday, Christmas Day, and the following Saturday, New Year's Day we will be closed. NEW HEALTH INSURANCE PROTECTION

The enactment of a health insurance program gave new meaning to Social Security for thousands of Senior Citizens, Floyd B. Ellington, Social Security District Manager in San Angelo, said today.

Health insurance protection become effective July 1, 1966. For that reason, older persons should not drop any private health insurance policies before next July. Some policies will be revised to consider medicare

"Almost everyone who is 65 before 1868 will be eligible for the health insurance which is in two parts," according to Ellington.

The two parts are: "Hospital Insurance" and "Medical In-surance." Together, the two will go a long way toward pay-ing the cost of health care for most older persons.

All workers over 65 who have not applied for their retirement insurance need to sign up to receive the health protection. Even those who are still working and earn too much to receive the cash retirement benefits should take such action now.

Plans are being made to sign up recipients of state old age assistance. They should not call your company is you. on the social security office at this time. All other 65 year olds should apply right away, Ellington emphasized.



SOCIAL SECURITY

"You don't have to retire completely to get social security benefits," Floyd B. Ellington, social security district manager in San Angelo said

"If you earn \$1200 or less in a year, you are considered to be completely retired and would be entitled to all your benefits," he added.

If you earn over \$1200 in a year, you may be considered partly retired and entitled to part of your social security benefits. For example, a worker would have only one dollar in benefits withheld for every two dollars earned between \$1200 and \$1700. For earnings over \$1700 annually, one dollar in benefits is withheld for each dollar of earnings.
