

#### Memory is Not Enough

In memorizing your sales talk, don't become a robot. The trouble with many rote-learned presentations is that they sound stilted and canned. Get away from the monotone approach; practice voice inflexion, change of expression, etc. that will en-

liven your talk. Make sure there is a pause or two in your speech to allow the customer to cut in. He may want to give you an order. Also, don't become so wrapped up in your presentation that you forget about the buyer's problems.

Almost everything on a sales call can be anticipated. There is very little that should surprise you-if you are prepared. With proper backgrounding, you can ad lib your way through any
