




#### SCIENCE SKETCHES

LIQUID traveling from a nozzle at supersonic speed can cut wood and inch-thick concrete, according to a research team at the University of Michigan. The team used a jet of water one-thousandths of an inch thick, shooting it at three times the speed of sound. It cut through the one-inch concrete at a rate of 15 inches per minute.

1½ pounds ground beef 1/3 cup uncooked rolled oats egg, slightly beaten

2 tablespoons chopped parsley tablespoon Worcestershire 1 tablespoon minced green 1/2 teaspoon salt

Dash pepper 1/4 cup finely chopped onion 14 cup water Combine 1/2 can soup with all other ingredients except water; mix thoroughly. Shape firmly into a loaf; place in shallow baking pan. (Thorough mixing and firm shaping will result in a moist, easy-to-slice loaf.) Bake at 350° F. for 1 hour. Blend remaining soup with water and 2 tablespoons drippings; pour over loaf. Bake 15 minutes longer. Makes 6 servings.






