ing disability or retirement

The amount of the benefit depends on the earnings of ther
parent and the number parent and the number
dependents entitled to p dependents entitled to pay
ments on the parent's ac count. Student payments can be as high as $\$ 102$ per month
and more in future years. and more in future years.
Students whose benefits were stopped under the old
law when they reached age 18 law when they reached age 18
may be eligible to receive may be eligible to receive
payments now.
