

The secial security law now provides monthly benefits to unmarried students under age 22. These benefits are payable only on the record of an insured parent who is drawincent Daugintis. Pastor ing disability or retirement payments, or who is deceased. The amount of the benefit depends on the earnings of the parent and the number of dependents entitled to pay-ments on the parent's account. Student payments can be as high as \$102 per month and more in future years.

Students whose benefits were stopped under the old law when they reached age 18 may be eligible to receive payments now.


