



Protect Your Children Against Measles, Says The AMA

CHICAGO-Now is the time to have your children immunized against measles if they have not already received this protection, says the American Medical Association.

Many parents are surprised to learn how dangerous this common childhood disease really is. An estimated 250 American


children died from measles in 1966. More than 150 suffered measles encephalitis, sometimes called sleeping sickness, or brain fever. Encephalitis frequently leaves children with permanent disabilities, including mental retardation, deafness, and blindness.

Future tragedies can be prevented, because safe and effective measles vaccines are now available. In the past four years, these vaccines have helped cut the measles death rate in half.

It's possible that measles could be eradicated in the near future if more parents protected their children with immunization.

The AMA recommends that every infant be vaccinated when he is about one year old. All children over this age who have not been vaccinated and who have not had measles, should be immunized now.

The U. S. Departments of Agriculture's Farmers Home better Administration is equipped to handle the housing credit needs of low and moderate income Sterling County families as a result of legislation recently signed into law, according to Patrick F. ministration county supervisor. Sullivan said the Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act, signed last range of Sterling County families to qualify for housing loan authorities of the Farmers Home Administration.

The new legislation Sullivan continued, makes more mortgage credit available to low and moderate income families in Sterling County by increasing the level of activity of the Agency's rural housing loan program.

Here are some of the other changes in the rural housing loan program administered by the Farmers Home Administration:

-Many Sterling County who had to go the long route of planning, contracting and building a house can now buy newly constructed buildings. Before the new legislation, these families could only purchase previously occupied buildings.

-Qualified low-income families can now obtain housing credit from Farmers Home Administration on the basis of a cosigner. Previously, only those rural persons 62 years and older qualified for this assistance.

-The new legislation increases from \$1,000 to \$1,500 the maximum amount of assistance the agency can make for emergency repairs or improvements to owner-occupied rural housing or farm service buildings. This credit is not designed to upgrade a building but only to remove hazards to the health and the safety of the family and the community.

-Rural families on the verge of losing their homes through foreclosure may save their homes if a sound basis can be developed by the Farmerso Home Administration to efinance their debts.



Whatever is done in the reshufling of Congresional District lines will never please anyone completely. The Legislature will do the best it can, and it has a tremendously difficult job.


The Federal court in Houston retained jurisdiction over this matter when the Legislature redistricted two years ago, and now demands that the job be completed to meet the Su-preme's Court's decision on "One Man-One Vote."

Two years ago the State Legislature acted responsibly and met the requirement in the best possible way. They came as near to establishing Congressional Districts to provide equal population as was possible at the time. Of course, exact equality is an absolute impossibility, and the more nearly the Legislature approaches the requirement of the Court, the less community of interest there can be in a Congressional District. Presently, there are some ill arrangements, such as A&M at College Station being in the same District with T.C.U. in Ft. Worth, but, again, it was the best measure the Legislature could pass. 

Legislature acts again, there likely will be even more conflicts, but unless they do there is a danger of the 23 Members of Congress from Texas running at large. Obviously, this would be chaotic.

At present, our 17th Congressional District is approximately 9.5 percent under the average of 417,000. Other Districts are approximately 11 percent overpopulated, which makes a spread of a little more than 20 percent. It is assumed that the Federal Court will demand a more even apportionment.




