Eggs of the pecan nut casebearer were found in all parts of Sterling City on Wednesday morning. The eggs were still pale in color indicating that they had recently been laid.

This weekend will be a good time to spray for the control of the casebearer. The eggs hatch in 5 to 7 days depending on the weather and since the eggs were rather fresh, the weekend would be a good time to apply control measures if the weather permits.

One of the best controls for the casebearer calls for the use of a combination of malathion and Sevin. Use one and one-half pints of liquid or emulsion malathion and three pounds of 80% sevin per hundred gallons of water.

There were also some trees with infestation of small walnut caterpillars which defoliate the trees. They can be controlled with either Malathion or Sevin so the casebearer spray will take care of them if they are a pest.

At least two cases of shinnery poisoning have been diagnosed in cattle in this area. It is also prevalent in other areas in the state. There have been some death losses.

### Social Security

Older people in the Sterling City area who have paid doctor bills but have not yet claimed their medicare doctor bill insurance payments are invited to have their claims checked by the San Angelo social security office before mailing them to the medicare carrier, according to Ted F. Moellering, district manager.

"In the first six months of the medicare program some benefit payments were delayed because the applicants did not include all the necessary information with their claims," he said.

Moellering believes that most people will need this help only the first time they make a medical insurance claim. "The Medicare Handbook, which is given to all beneficiaries, explains how to make the claims," he said, "and the form is relatively simple, but most people can use some advice the first time they apply. We're glad to offer assistance, and we believe we can help many people to avoid some delay in their payment."

Moellering noted that the medicare claim may be made either by the patient or by the doctor, if he accepts assignment of the insurance. If the doctor applies for the medicare payment, he bills the patient only for any part of the \$50 deductible.

Under the other method of payment the doctor bills the patient, the patient pays the bill, and then the patient sends the completed request for payment form to the medicare carrier. A statement from the doctor showing the treatment given and the charges already paid by the patient must be furnished either on the request for payment form or in a separate receipted bill.

In the Sterling City area, medicare doctor bill insurance is handled by Blue Cross-Blue Shield in Dallas.

The same simple one-page

request for payment form is mailed to the carrier no matter whether the payment is to go to the patient or to the doctor. Doctor's offices, accustomed to filling out insurance forms, should have no difficulty providing the few items of information requested, Moellering noted. But handling of forms received directly from medicare beneficiaries is sometimes delayed because some essential item of information has been omitted.

If the beneficiary leaves out his medicare identification number, for example, it is impossible to verify that he is signed up for the doctor bill insurance, or how much of his deductible amount has been paid. Some elderly people with failing eyesight are unable to make legible entries. And some do not get adequately itemized receipts from their physicians, or forget to enclose the receipts with their claims. If the request for payment form is incomplete or improperly filled out the medicare carrier has to write back to the beneficiary, thus delaying the payment.

"The social security office does not make the decision or pay the claim," Moellering said. "The law requires that the payments be handled through the selected medicare carriers. But we can answer general question about medicare and help people in the Sterling City area get their applications ready for review by the carrier."

"If an older person cannot visit the social security office in person, he can send the forms by mail or by someone else," he said, "but in this case, he should be sure to give his telephone number."

The San Angelo social security office is located at 3000 West Harris. The phone number is 949-4608. Office hours are from 8:30 a.m. - 7:30 p.m. on Monday, and 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Tuesday through Friday.

### NEW LEGISLATION TO HELP STERLING COUNTY FAMILIES OBTAIN HOUSING

The U. S. Departments of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration is better equipped to handle the housing credit needs of low and moderate income Sterling County families as a result of legislation recently signed into law, according to Patrick F. Sullivan, Farmers Home Administration county supervisor.

Sullivan said the Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act, signed last month by President Johnson, makes it possible for a broader range of Sterling County families to qualify for housing loan authorities of the Farmers Home Administration.

The new legislation Sullivan continued, makes more mortgage credit available to low and moderate income families in Sterling County by increasing the level of activity of the Agency's rural housing loan program.

Here are some of the other changes in the rural housing loan program administered by the Farmers Home Administration:

—Many Sterling County who had to go the long route of planning, contracting and building a house can now buy newly constructed buildings. Before the new legislation, these families could only purchase previously occupied buildings.

—Qualified low-income families can now obtain housing credit from Farmers Home Administration on the basis of a cosigner. Previously, only those rural persons 62 years and older qualified for this assistance.

—The new legislation increases from \$1,000 to \$1,500 the maximum amount of assistance the agency can make for emergency repairs or improvements to owner-occupied rural housing or farm service buildings. This credit is not designed to upgrade a building but only to remove hazards to the health and the safety of the family and the community.

—Rural families on the verge of losing their homes through foreclosure may save their homes if a sound basis can be developed by the Farmers Home Administration to refinance their debts.

—Financial assistance can be given to construct rental housing for low and moderate income rural families of all age groups. Previously, rental housing financed by FHA had to be occupied by rural people 62 years and older.

Loans by the Farmers Home Administration are made to Sterling County applicants who are unable to obtain credit they need from private lenders at reasonable rates and terms.
