World's Largest Plane to Take Test Flights


CANTON, OHIO - The U. S. Air Force C-5 Galaxy recently unveiled by the Lockheed-Georgia Company is scheduled for test flights in June of this year. Gross equipped landing wheels under safe low tire pressure, this massive plane can utilize airfields classified for medium to heavy loads without causing any critical runway deterioration. Almost 85 yards long, it has a wing span of 223 feet and towers 65 feet into the air. Carrying a maximum payload, the C-5 Galaxy can cover 2,500 nautical miles in less than 6 hours.
