Postal Rate Rise
PARCEL POST - CATALOG
Postmaster W, B Brook reminded postal patrons today that higher parcel post and fect Saturday, October 19 . The rate increase will aver age 10.5 per cent and in mos cases will mean an additional ten cents per parcel. The higher rates were approved by the Interstate Commerce Commission in July. Under the new rates the
minimum charge for local parminimum charge for local par
cel delivery will go from 40 to 50 cents. The minimum charge for parcels destined outside the local delivery area
will be raised from 50 to 60 will b
cents.
cents.
Almost all parcels that are Almost all parcels that are
charged up to $\$ 1.10$ under the present rates will go up 10 cents. This accounts for more than 80 percent of all parcel post, postmaster Brooks point ed out.
There will be a 15 -cent hike on most parcels now charged
between between $\$ 1.10$ and $\$ 4.00$, and
a 20 -cent increase a 20 -cent increase on pa
now charged over $\$ 4.00$. Parcel post rates are based
on the weight on the weight of the package
and the distance it is mailed and the distance it is mailed Higher rates for the deliv ery of packages and catalog
are required to bring revenue from this type of mail within four percent of operating costs, as required by law, the postmaster explained. Th higher rates are designed to
put parcels and catalogs, which put parcels and catalogs, which
are fourth class mail, on break even basis.
Additional revenue is need ed from parcel post and catalogs to offset higher costs re sultin from pay increases approved last year for postal
employees.

## Newcomers Can Vo Until November 1

 Voters in the coming electionwho moved into the county
on or after May 5, 1968, must
vote in the county clerk's of-
fice by November 1, accord-
ing to information received
from county clerk W.W. Dur-
ham.
Formerly, persons who mov-
ed from one county to anoth-
er could not vote during the
first six months after the
change of residence, but a
new law enated last year
now permits them to vote on
noll statewide offices, includ-
all
ing President and Vice Pres-
dent, and on proposed consti-
tutional amendments, but not
on local offices and issues.
However, instead of voting
at a regular polling place on
election day, they must vote
during a special time period in
the county clerk's office in
the county of their new resi-
dence. This period, which is
the same as the period for ab--
sentee voting, began on Oct.
16 and will end on November

1. If the voter has lived in the
If
same congressional, legislative
or judicial district for six
months, he may also vote on
that district office.
In order to vote, the person
must be reistered as a Texas
voter for the 1968 voting year
and he should have his regisand he should have his regis-
tration certificate with him tration certificate with him
when he applies for his ballot
at the county celrk's office when he applies for his ballot
at the county celrk's office.
However, if he has lost his
certificate, he may vote after
