



HELP WANTED Social Security Tips

"Social security relies to a great extent on each beneficiary's ability to report events which will affect his monthly payments" ,said Ted F. Moellering, Social Security District Manager. Among those events that the beneficiary should report are changes of address, stopping or starting work, changes in estimated earnings during the year, and a beneficiary's death, marriage, divorce, or annulment.

Each beneficiary receives a special card to fill out and send to his local social security office when a report must be made. Reports are relayed information causing the arto the paying office by electronic means to avoid delays in updating records.






