

'BLOODLESS SCALPEL' that allows surgeons to make clean incisions without fear of hemorrhage has been developed at the University of Utah. A highly ionized gas is concentrated into a thin jet at the tip of an insulated hand piece. The jet---with a minimum temperature of 10,000 degrees F .--- literally "vaporizes" the moisture in tissue.

THE SATURN ROCKET must be fed fuel pressurized by compressed helium, which is inert and will not react with the propellant or plumbing. Pennsylvania Forge, Philadelphia, which machined containers to hold the helium, says the lightweight gas is stored in aluminum "bottles" 211.8 inches long, 19.1 inches in diameter and 0.90 inches thick. Despite their size the four containers required for a firing are almost lost inside the rocket's huge liquid oxygen

Mr. Moellering reminded Sterling City readers that social security benefits are payable to workers when they have become too disabled to age 18 (and those 18 to 22 who are full-time students) and his






