



NOTICE AFFORDING OP-PORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC HEARING

The Texas Highway Department is planning the improvement of U.S. 87 from 3.6 miles northwest of the Coke County line, southeast a distance of approximately 8.2 miles to the Tom Green County line.

Improvements will consist of construction of a four lane diided higvhway along the location of the existing highway and the utilization of the old railroad right-of-way for the north bound traffic lanes. No additional right-of-way will be required.

Maps and other drawings showing the proposed location and geometric design and any other information about the proposed project are on file and available for inspection and copying at the Resident! Engineer's office at Sterling City, Texas. Also, the drawings show the proposed geometric design have been placed on file with counties of Coke and Sterling located at Robert Lee and Sterling City.

Any interested citizen may request that a public hearing be held covering the social, economic, and environmental effects of the proposed location and design for this highway project by delivering a written request to the Resident Engineer's offiec on or before October 24, 1969.

In the event such a request is received, a public hearing will be scheduled and adequate notice will be publisized about the date and location of the hearing.





HOSPITAL INSURANCE BENEFITS

The hospital insurance benefits of Medicare provide for services of three types, accordin to Ted F. Moellering, manager of the San Angelo social security district office. Benefits are possible when you are (1) a bed patient in a hospital, (2) a bed patient in an extended care facility (skilled nursing home) assigned there by your physician as a followup to hospital care, and (3) a patient at home receiving home health services, Mr. Moellering continued. There has been some thought that because you are covered under Medicare up to a certain maximum number of days, you can automatically count on that number of days regardless of your condition. Mr. Moellering went on to say that this is a misunderstanding and that when your condition improves to the extent you no longer require the level of care provided, then your eligibility ceases.

An example of this misunderstanding is the 100 day eligibility in an Extended Care Facility. We are sometimes asked why a certain person was told Medicare would no longer pay for his stay in an Extended Care Facility when he had only been there 50 days and still had 50 days coming. The condition of the patient rather than the number of days is the controlling factor up to the point that the maximum number of days is reached. Coverage ends when his condition is such that he no longer needs the level of care provided by the Extended Care Facility.


