

U.S. Border Patrol Seeks Applicants

The U.S. Border Patrol of the Immigration and Naturalization Service has an urgent need for physically fit young men desiring a career in Federal law enforcement work. This is a career opportunity for those who like action and outdoor work.

The Border Patrol is the mobile, uniformed enforcement branch of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Its principle purpose is to prevent the smuggling and illegal entry of aliens into the United States. The border patrolmen, called Immigration Patrol Inspectors, work along international buondaries, al though their duties are not necessarily confined to these areas. They work in jeeps cars, on foot, in boats and even in airplanes. Officers in vestigate violations of the immigration laws and frequently make arrests. They are often required to work irregular hours, under all weather conditions. These duties demand mental alertness as well as exceptional physical vigor and stamnia.

The entrance salary of an Immigration Patrol Inspector is \$7,639 a year (Grade GS-7). There are promotional opportunities up to executive levels in the Immigration and Naturalization Service. On-the-job training offers splendid opportunities for promotion to positions of greater responsibil-

No experience is required for these positions. To qualify, applicants must pass a written test of verbal abilities, judgment, and aptitude for learning a foreign language. Candidates who pass the written test are called for oral interviews in the order of their standing on the list. The oral interview is designed to determine if the candidate has the personal qualities needed for the work. Applicants must also pass a rigid physical examination. Candidates who are selected for appointment are assigned to the Border Patrol Academy for a period of intensive training in such subjects as immigration laws, Spanish, physical training and marksmanship. Trainees receive full pay while in the academy.

Applications are now being accepted for the civil service examination for Immigration Patrol Inspector which will be held on Saturday, January 24, 1970. An additional examina-tion is scheduled for April, 1970. However, those wishing to be tested in January must submit their applications before December 19, 1969. Full information is given in Announcement No. WAM-911 which may be secured from Interagency Boards of Examiners and from many post offices as well as any office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Applications should be submitted on the tearout application form on the announcement or CSC Form 50000AB and forwarded to the Interagency Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners for Washington, D.C. 1900 E St., N.W., Washington, D.C. _0415.



PROGRESS REPORT: GIVING POLLUTION THE AIR

In the summer of 1928, thousands of weekenders and vacationers flocking to Lake Erie's sandy beaches found a strange and disturbing sight. Large areas of the lake, seemingly overnight, had become covered with a thick, green, evil-smelling carpet of scum.

Lake Erie, 42 years ago, had become one of the earliest victims of man-accelerated eutrophication—the stimulation of excessive algal growth. This is phication—the stimulation of excessive algal growth. This is how it happened, and is still happening all over America: happening all over America:

The decay process uses up much of the oxygen dissolved in the water, making it unsuitable for many forms of aquatic life, like game

and commercial fish. Though eutrophication is a normal, and very slow, occur-rence in nature, it is greatly accelerated by the unchecked introduction of the raw waste products of our society into

our waters. Though the long-term solution to this problem is a nationwide commitment to proper and complete sewage treatment, there exists today an effective intermediary means of improving water quality. Formerly polluted lakes have already been successfully reclaimed by aeration.

Mechanical aeration purifies waters and controls accelerated eutrophication the way nature does-by mixing water with air. It also stimulates a return of game fish and other forms of desirable aquatic life.

This man-made nature's aid has proven itself in bodies of water ranging in size from oneacre ponds to a 31/2 mile long, 140-foot deep reservoir and has

In the past, it was widely believed that by limiting the supply of the 15 to 20 different nutrient elements that algae feed on, effective eutrophication controls could be established. Phosphorus," in from household detergents, in an effort to minimize algal growth.

It was later discovered, however, that even if it were possible to completely eliminate phosphorus input into Lake Erie, phosphates already deposited in the bottom sediments could still support algal growth for at least another 100 years. Therefore, the removal of phosphates from detergents as a "first step" would be no step at all in solving the eutro-

Social Security News

"Processing time can be cut in half if people are prepared when the time comes to apply for social security benefits," says J. M. Talbot, social security manager.

Being prepared is not as difficult as many people believe. Remember to take along your social security card or the card of the person on whose record you are filing. For a widow, this would be the social security card of her late husband. This may sound hard to believe, but many people do come in to file their application and leave their number at home.

The next most important document to take with you is your birth certificae, if available. Proof of age is needed to qualify for nearly all social security benefits. If your birth was recorded when you were born or if you were baptized before age five, you will need one of these documents. If you don't have a copy, make arrangements now to get one, Mr. Talbot advises.

If you birth was not recorded and you were not baptized before age five, there are other documents you can use. In most cases, the earlier the record was made the better it is for helping to establish your date of birth.

The third thing that is needed in all claims is evidence of the worker's last year's earnings and an estimate of this year's earnings. Your W. 2 Form or tax return for last year will give the information for last year. Be sure to bring these with you.

CHECK YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY RECORD

"How do I know my work under social security is being credited to my record, and how do I find out about it? This is one of the questions most frequently asked," says J. M. Talbot, social security man-

In explaining the process involved in reporting social seccurity, Mr. Talbot said, -'When you work for wages, your employer deducts social security tax from your paycheck each pay day. At the end of each calendar quarter, he submits your name and number with payment for these taxes to Internal Revenue. Internal Revenue forwards copies to social security's main office in Baltimore, Maryland. Your wages are then posted to your record. The same process is followed for a self-employed person except that his earnings are recorded yearly."

Mr. Talbot states that the possibility of an error being made in the process does exist. He recommends that you request a statement of your earnings at least every three years.

All you have to do to secure the statement is to send a post card request available at your social security office to Baltimore, Maryland. If the reply you receive is incorrect in any way, contact the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harris Avenue (P. O. Box 3808) in San Angelo, Texas, or see the representative when he is in your area.
