Shortage of Natural Gas Is Cause

A shortage of natural gas over the nation, and gas is found in the southwest part of the United States, has caused some price increases by companies, including Ramgas, Inc., the company serving Sterling City. Ramgas buys its gas wholeseale from the El Paso Natural Gas Co., and two months ago the wholesaler advanced prices 24% to Ramgas, and the local company got permission from the Rail-"oad Commission's Oil and Gas Division to raise rates correspondingly here, said the manager A.C. Lively. In fact, the past two month's bills have been charged on the increased rates-whether you as a customer knew it or not.

In fact, El Paso Natural Gas Co. is somewhat rationing gas to some cities, and only new residential customers may tie on-no new businesses are accepted as customers in places. Lively said Ramgas has a 25 year contract with El Paso Natural Gas for gas here and will always have enough to serve Sterling City. SOCIAL SECURITY

"Processing time can be cut in half if people are prepared when the time comes to apply for social security benefits," says J. M. Talbot, social secur-

Being prepared is not as lifficult as many people beieve. Remember to take along your social security card or the card of the person on whose record you are filing. For a widow, this would be the social security card of her late husband. This may sound hard to believe, but many people do come in to file their application and leave their number

The next most important document to take with you is our birth certificae, if available. Proof of age is needed to qualify for nearly all social ecurity benefits. If your birth was recorded when you were born or if you were baptized before age five, you will need one of these documents. If you don't have a copy, make arrangements now to get one, Mr. Talbot advises.

If you birth was not recorded and you were not baptized before age five, there are other documents you can use. In most cases, the earlier the record was made the better it is for helping to establish your date of birth.

The third thing that is needed in all claims is evidence of the worker's last year's earnings and an estimate of this year's earnings. Your W-2 Form or tax return for last year will give the information for last year. Be sure to bring these with you.

"If I apply for disability benefits, do I have to be examined by a social security doctor before I can get any checks?" This is a question frequently asked when disabled workers claim social security disability insurance benefits.

J. M. Talbot, social security manager, says the social security law requires the applicant to supply the medical records on his condition. When you apply for benefits, you must provide a report from your attending doctor or hospital.

Information from the attending doctor and the hospital is generally all that is needed. However, in some instances. a specialist's report may be necessary to clarify a question or resolve a borderline situation. You may then be asked to go for a special examination to help provide the extra information.

When you apply for disability benefits, be ready to give the names and addresses of all your sourses of medical treatment for your disabling

Both delightful and surprising will be this shrimp and rice spectacular, a molded affair exactly right for buffet serving. And no ho-hum mixture, this. Flavor runs deep. And the texture, interesting with as many shrimp as can be spared, is blissfully moist and creamy.

SHRIMP AND RICE CREAM MOLD

2 cans (41/2 ounces each) shrimp

3/4 cup uncooked rice 134 cups chicken broth

1 envelope unflavored gelatin 1/2 cup freshly grated onion

1/2 teaspoon white pepper

1/3 cup mayonnaise 1 cup heavy cream, whipped

Drain shrimp, reserving canned liquid. Chill. Combine rice and broth; simmer, covered, 20-25 minutes, stirring frequently to make rice "starchy." Soften gelatin in shrimp liquid; stir into hot rice. 


