In explaining the process involved in reporting social sec curity, Mr. Talbot said, -'When you work for wages, your em-
ployer deducts social security ployer deducts social security

"Did you know that if you

tural business, the hired work may be covered by social se curity?" J. M. Talbot, socia

and earns $\$ 150$ or more for and earns $\$ 150$ or more for
one employer during any year one employer during any yea a time basis for an agricultur business, is covered by socia
security. Even part-time em ployees could meet the ear nings or work test. You, as their employer, would
liable to withhold social secur ity tax from the employee's check, match that tax your self, and report the earning
at the end of the year. at the end of the year.
The report of agricultural en ployees must be filed with
the Internal Revenue Service by January 31 of the following year. Reports should
be on Internal Revenue Service Form 943--showing each employee's name, social secur-
ity number, and amount paid The report should be accom employee's pay and matched by employer.
To be sure which employees to report, Mr. Talbot recom-
mends keeping records mends keeping records on
