

> Driver education teacher Bobby Dodds will be instructing the class.

The Texas Education Agency purchased 31 mobile vans for contract use by the 20 Education Service Centers in the State. Two vans were designated for use in the Region 15 service area, which covers 18 counties.

The 12 by 60 foot van comes equipped with 18 film lessons dealing with habits, attitudes, emotions physical capabilities, natural and man-made laws, driving procedures and weather and road problems. Curriculum is correlated with state approved driver education textbooks.

Students will go through 32 hours of instruction in the van to complete the classroom phase of driver education.

The vans are outfitted with an instructor console which provides immediate and cumulative records of individual student and class responses. Responses are automatically recorded on instant-reading meters in a central console, giving the instructor a continuing progress report.

The multi-media system encourages active class participation by requiring students to respond to programmed filmed questions and situations. Student responders retain each individual's selected answer until another alternative is chosen. This allows the student to re-evaluate his original choice. The student is able to respond to a driving situation, evaluate his progress and exercise judgment making.

The van is carpeted, panelled air-conditioned and heated.




