





Social Security Tips

"Processing time can be cut in half if people are prepared when the time comes to apply for social security benefits," says J. M. Talbot, social security manager.

Being prepared is not as \$3.00 A YEAR IN COUNTY difficult as many people be-\$3.50 A YEAR IN STATE lieve. Remember to take along \$4.00 A YEAR OUT STATE your social security card or the card of the person on whose RECORD established in 1899 record you are filing. For a widow, this would be the social security card of her late Cards of Thanks, reader or husband. The next most important visitors, your parties, etc. your birth certificae, if available. Proof of age is needed to qualify for nearly all social security benefits. If your birth was recorded when you were born or if you were baptized before age five, you will need Sunday Mass 12 Noon one of these documents. If you Thursday mass __ 7:00 p.m. don't have a copy, make arrangements now to get one, Mr. Talbot advises.

If you birth was not record-Morning worship 11:00 a.m. ed and you were not baptized Evening Classes 6 p.m. before age five, there are other documents you can use. In most cases, the earlier the record was made the better it is for helping to establish your date of birth.
