Each calendar quarter, the Social Security Administra-
tion receives employer reports on receives employer reports social security numbers of employees, according to J.M. Talbot, social security manager. These incorrect reports, in many cases, happen when girl has married but does social security records.
Mr. Talbot stated that when a girl marries, she should com-
plete a 'Request for Change plete a 'Request for Change
in Social Security Record' form. After completing the form. After completing the
form and returning it to the social security office with her old card, she will be issued
a new social security card with the same number but showing the new name
If the name and number re-
ported by an employer do not ported by an employer do not
match the name and number on file with the Social Security Administration, the earnings might not get to the
proper account. This could reproper account.
sult in a later loss of social security benefits or in
smaller benefit being paid.
"Did you know that if you operate any type of agricultural business, the hired work may be covered by social semarity?" J. M. Talbot, social security manager, asks.
Any employee who works
and earns $\$ 150$ or more for one employer during any year or works at least 20 days on
a time basis for an agriculture a time basis for an agriculture
business, is covered by social security. Even part-time employees could meet the earnings or work test. You, their employer, would be
liable to withhold social ity tax from the employee's check, match that tax your self, and report the earnings at the end of the year. The report of agricultural employees must be filed with
the Internal Revenue Service by January 31 of the following year. Reports should be on Internal Revenue Service Form 943-showing each employee's name, social security number, and amount paid.
The report should be accompanied by tax withheld from employee's pay and matched by employer.
To be sure which employees to report, Mr. Talbot recom-
mends keeping records on anyone working for you in your agricultural business.
