A yearling ram fleece entered by Foster S. Price was chosen Grand Champion Fleece of the Adult Division of the Sonora Wool and Mohair Show last week. The fleece won first place honors in its class before being declared Champion Range Fleece and then Grand Champion. This is the eighth time in the past nine years that Price fleeces have been grand champion at the Sonora which is now open to the world.

Other placings won by Price fleeces were: second and fifth in the yearling ewe class, Foster S. Price; first and fourth place aged ewe fleece, Allen Price; second and third place aged ewe fleeces, Foster; fifth and sixth place aged ewe fleeces, Frank Price. In the aged ram class, the first and second place fleeces were entered by Foster.

Two fleeces entered in the Registered Delaine Division of the show, Junior Division, by Bennie and Delmer Radde, also placed well. The two entered the second place yearling fleece. Bennie entered the first place yearling ram fleece.

Congratulations to all the Sterling County entrants. They showed the quality of the wool produced here.

Sterling County has managed to stay out of the confirmed screwworm case listing thus far in 1974. Nearby counties have had cases confirmed this year but all the local samples mailed in by producers have been identified as nonscrewworm.

Nearby counties with confirmed cases include Irion, Glasscock, Tom Green, Reagan, Crockett, Concho and Runnels.

The latest report of the Southwest Screwworm Eradication Program shows a total of 983,261,400 sterile flies released in the southwestern United States and Mexico. Of this total, 523,731,800 were released in Texas.

Sterling County 4-H Club members who had livestock projects during this year are reminded of the Record Book Preparation Workshop to be held in the courthouse this afternoon (Friday) beginning at 2 P. M. The record books are an important part of the project showing what was achieved in the way of dollars and cents. While the projects differ from an actual livestock operation, they indicate what it takes to feed an animal. Also, the preparation of the workbook prepares the youngster for adult life where records are an everyday occurrence, whether they be engaged in livestock production or some other enterprise. There is no place today where records are not vital either for financial reasons or for tax reporting purposes.

What is the size of the American farm? No, not the average size of an agricultural unit but what would every American own if they had a farm.

Based on the population and the land area, each would own 20 acres of farmland plus 4 acres of grazing land. This would include about one acre of corn and nearly an acre of wheat according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Animal numbers on this acreage are even more interesting in that each would own one-fifth of a dairy cow producing 250 gallons of milk a year. As

'If your check is lost or stolen, get in touch with your nearest social security office at once,' a spokesman said. 'The check can be replaced, but it takes time. Handle your check carefully when you get it and you won't have to wait while it's being replaced.'

Social security pays over \$4 billion a month in benefit checks to almost 29 million people—eligible retired and disabled workers and their families and families of deceased workers who worked long enough under social security.

The beef herd would total two cows that dropped nine-tenths of a calf. Your lone hog would have a litter of 1.6 pigs. One-third of a sheep would roam your pasture.

Everybody's farm also had 5.6 hens producing 103 dozen eggs, 56 broilers, and 2.5 turkeys. This farm was valued at \$4,818 plus \$726 for machinery and motor vehicles.

The make-believe farm grossed \$1,684 in 1973 but after subtracting \$1,198 in production expenses, the remaining net income was \$486. Sound familiar? The return amounts to \$20 an acre on land valued at from a low of perhaps a hundred dollars an acre to several thousand dollars depending on its location and production potential.






REDDY'S VACATION TIPS



Clip and save this vacation checklist.

- REFRIGERATOR OR FREEZER: Change thermostat control to slightly warmer (or "Vacation") setting according to the manufacturer's recommendations.
- DISHWASHER: Make sure it's empty. Shut the door, but do not latch.
- DISPOSER: Run and flush with cold water.
- ELECTRIC RANGE: Make sure all switches are in the "Off" position.
- WASHERS: Turn off water supply at faucets.
- WATER HEATER (ELECTRIC): Turn off at circuit breaker panel. When you return, run a small amount of water from a hot water faucet to make sure there is water in the tank before you turn the circuit on.
- TRASH COMPACTOR: Remove any accumulated trash.
- TELEVISION SETS: Unplug from electric outlet and disconnect the antenna lead-in cable.
- CLOCK RADIOS, ETC.: Check these and all other items with automatic "On-Off" controls. Disconnect the ones that won't be needed.
- LIGHTING: Be sure that all lights are off except those needed for security, such as: 1) yard light and/or other exterior lighting with automatic controls—on at dusk, off at dawn; 2) portable lamp in living area with automatic control; 3) hall or bathroom light.
- AIR CONDITIONING: Normally, air conditioning should be turned off completely while on summer vacation. However, if there is anything in your home that might suffer heat damage, the thermostat setting could be raised 5 to 10 degrees above normal operation and the unit left on. For comfort, you might have a friend or neighbor turn on the unit the day of your return.

Contract Awarded for New Post Office at Garden City

Midland, Texas — McKinney Construction Co. of Jones, Okla. has been awarded a contract for the construction of a new post office at Garden City, Texas.

Postmaster/SCF Manager David E. Holster of Midland, and Robert L. McCoy, manager, San Antonio Postal District, said the firm was the lowest of five bids received recently.

The contract calls for the construction of a building to contain 1,045 sq. feet of interior floor space to be built on a site containing 19,500 sq. feet on State Highway 158. The Postal Service obtained an option to the property from its owners Felix and Mrs. Elizabeth Cox of Midland.

Postmaster V. M. Gill, of Garden City, said the building is to be completed in five to eight months, and will lease it to the postal service for a basic period of ten years, with options on 20 additional years.
