

Coal Slurry Pipeline Construction Proposed For Lamb County

Plans are currently underway by the Energy Transportation Systems, Inc. (ETSI) for a coal slurry pipeline to be built to the Southwestern Public Service Company's Tolk Station, located north east of Mule-

Officials of the pipelines have asked the Texas Railroad Commission for the authority to construct the Texas portion of the line. The proposed line as it now stands would run from Wyoming to Houston,

A certificate of public convenience to obtain right

of way through eminent domain has been applied for, but no hearing date has been set on the application filed by the ETSI. The joint venture project

which is owned and operated by subsidiaries of Texas Eastern Corp., Bechtel Petroleum, Inc., KN Energy, Inc., and Inter-North, Inc., the system is an 1800 mile long underground pipeline system which is designed to transport 20 to 25 million tons of low sulfer coal per year as a waterbased slurry from the Powder Basin coal fields in

proposed building is to promote economical development and growth in the Muleshoe area, as well as to create job opportunities, C. R. Patel the spokesman for three operating motels objections relating to this. Patel maintained that there are now over 50 units in Muleshoe that are not being utilized. "We get about seven new customers among

the three motels per week and make around \$12,000 to \$15,000 per month in a slow period," Patel said. "A new motel would take those customers from us and drive us out of business," he said. A point made by Gordon H. Green who is a director of the Muleshoe Indusdtrial Development Corporation was the fact that the proposed motel would increase the tax receipts for \$4,800 at the current 48

cents rate. Patel countered this by telling the directors and others present that each of the three motels in Muleshoe pay from \$3 to \$4 thousand in taxes at the present time. "You may gain the \$4,800," he said, but you will lose our taxes, because we will be forced out of business.

A local taxpayer, Dan Vinson, questioned the Corporation on the increase in local taxes. Jeff Smith, Chairman of the Industrial Development Corporation assured Vinson that there would be no tax increase to local taxpayers, since increases on this type of thing is strictly prohibited by state

Judge Gordon Green made it plain to the assembly that the County nor the City would in any way be liable for the bonds. "We are not backing these bonds," he stated "They are merely a vehicle by which new developments can be financed in our area on a tax exempt basis." The bank that buys these bonds will not pay any interest on the Industrial Revenue Bonds. Any taxes will be paid by the Corporation

Adams said the revised DWI statute will aid in the prosecution of drunk driv-

"Under the present law, a person is only presumed to be intoxicated if tests reveal a blood alcohol concentration of .10 per cent or more," Adams said. "The new law establishes that a driver is definitely too drunk to drive at the .10 per cent level."

The revised statute also contains provisions for automatic 90-day suspension of driving privileges for refusal to submit to an alcohol chemical test. The refusal also will be admissible evidence in the driver's trial. The drunk driver's vehicle may be confiscated and sold upon the fourth DWI convic-


The DPS director predicted that the statute will help deter DWI violations and provide the means to identify repeat offenders.

"Despite increased DWI arrests and enhanced public awareness about this problem, far too many people still believe that there are no unfavorable consequences to drunk driving," said. "Texas law enforce-

ment agencies do not have enough resources to adequately police all streets and highways. However, when these changes in the DWI law take effect, drunk drivers who are detected can count on being punished in a meaningful fashion. This should help discourage drunk driving," concluded Adams.



The Muleshoe Industrial Development Corporation was formed about two years ago, when some other companies were looking at Muleshoe as a location for their businesses. foundation was organized through SPAG and approved by the Bailey County Commissioners Court to be used as an entity to enable the issuance of tax free bonds for the express purpose of creating new jobs, adding to economical development and taxes. They are restricted to that purpose. The three local men involved in the Corporation are Jeff Smith, Bill Liles and Gordon H. Green; with Michael Caldwell serving as counsel for the group.

The land for the proposed motel is being purchased from an individual land owner in Muleshoe, through the Summit Savings; and it is likely that the property will be annexed to the City of Muleshoe in the near future.

The developers were present for the later part of the hearing, and presented a sketch of the proposed new motel. The motel will have restaurant facilities, said Ken Smith. but there is enough land there to enable building of one in the future. "There will be a heated swimming pool, Smith stated. "We are not in the restaurant business, so we will leave that to someone else," the developer stated. "Several of the larger motels in the Amarillo area built in the last few years have been financed by this kind of bonding," explained Caldwell, attorney for the MIDC.

Jeff Smith, spokesman for the MIDC was asked if the Industrial Corporation had any plans of seeking other new industries for the area. Smith stated that they were and were in contact with some of those who are looking for locations sites. He mentioned the possibility of an alcohol plant locating in the area in the future. "Most towns the size of Muleshoe are lucky to get a one new large business in seven years-Muleshoe has had three in the last two years," Smith commented, in an attempt to indicate the of Muleshoe's growth.

Darrell Turner of Summit Savings stated to the group that he personally felt that "competition helps sometimes. It tends to make like businesses "clean up their act" and strive for better services or goals in order to keep their customers." Turner also stated however, that if it were a savings and loan operation, he would probably fight it as hard as

he could in order to save his own business. John Gulley, manager of

the Muleshoe Chamber of Commerce stated that although he was not speaking for the Chamber, he felt that the increase in the job market would be good, as well as the 'trickle-down' business to local restaurants, gas stations, etc. "It's (the motel) easy access and proximity to the Bailey County Civic Center could result in possible convention trade of service clubs and other organizations in Muleshoe, which would mean income to the area," Gulley stated. Patel maintained, "The most activity would come in the construction period, and not after the motel was built."

The Industrial Corporation was questioned as to the number of jobs that the motel would ultimately create, but a definite answer was not given. 

Wyoming to power plants in Texas. Presently, 90 percent of the right of way outside of Texas has already been obtained. The pipeline would cross portions of three other states as well as Texas.

Plans are to build 11 miles of pipeline in Lamb County, which will cost about \$79 million initially and will bring in \$1,100,000 in ad valorem taxes to Lamb County annually, according to estimates. No contracts have yet been negotiated with landowners or prospective users, but is scheduled to be done in the near future. If all goes as projected ESTI officials say that the construction would begin in 1985 and be completed in 1987.

Littlefield officials project that the proposed pipelines could result in jobs and an increase in tax revenues to Lamb County and local governments aside from the potential energy costs savings on lower fuel transportation costs for electric consumers.

Factors in blood type

By Lawrence Lamb, M.D.

DEAR DR. LAMB - I read that if both parents have positive blood types it is not possible to have a baby with negative type blood, even if a grandparent has negative blood, because blood type comes from the parents only.

I was told 27 years ago that I had O positive and my husband has had his typed several times and his is A

positive. Our oldest child definitely has negative type blood. What is your opinion of this? He is definitely the father and I am definitely the

DEAR READER - Well, you are living proof that two parents who are Rh positive can have an offspring with Rh negative blood. That is not exactly news to medical

The point of confusion for most people is that there are two types of Rh positive blood groups. To understand that, you need to know that there are two gene locations that determine Rh. We have paired genes.

Let us say that the dominate gene is called positive (+) and the other gene is the weaker and called negative (-). Now a person with the paired genes of (+,-) will test out as Rh positive. He is an Rh positive heterozygous type. He can give his offspring the plus or negative

If the mother is also a heterozygous Rh positive she can also transmit the positive gene or the negative gene (d form for the purists). It follows that if both heterozygous Rh positive parents provide a negative gene the offspring will have a pair of negative genes and be Rh negative. It is a little more complicated than that, but, in essence, that is the way it

happens.

If a parent had a pair of positive genes (DD for the purists), he can only transmit a positive gene and the offspring would definitely be Rh positive but the rub is that Rh heterozygous gene pairs are different from Rh homozygous gene pairs even though both type out as Rh positive.

The importance of the Rh factor in pregnancies is discussed in The Health Letter 6-4, Blood Type, Rh Factor and Transfusions, which I am sending you. DEAR DR. LAMB - In your column about undescended testicles you answered the question about fertility, but you didn't say that he might not live to father a child. A good percent of these turn to cancer by the time the people are 20 years

DEAR READER - Cancer is a consideration but not as big a concern as you evidently think. To put things in perspective, statistics show that in 1978 in the entire United State there were only 329 deaths from cancer of the testicle in men aged 15 to 34. That is the age group in which the problem is most likely to arise

Cancer of an undescended testicle is now believed to be more common in intersex individuals (abnormal people whose characteristics fall between those of males and females). But some reports state that cancer of the testicle is 11 times as common if the testicle is in the inguinal canal (the abdominal wall) and 50 times more common for those in the abdomen. But again that still is not a large number when you consider that all cancers of the testicles caused only 329 deaths in the 15 to 34 age group.



As the Jews began to repair their Temple and rekindle the holy lights, they found that they only had enough oil for one day.

The time needed for the Temple's restoration was eight days.

The Jews went ahead and lit the lamps anyway as they had no other choice, and this is when the miracle occured — the oil in the lamps burned for the entire eight days!

This began the traditional celebration of Hanukkah, the Festival of Lights.

Over the years, Hanukkah has been honored with many joyous customs, such as lighting the menorah, giving gifts to one another, sharing special foods, singing songs and generally spending this happy occasion together.

One of the most delightful Jewish customs at this time is spinning the dreidel. The ancient dreidel is a four-sided top on which each side is written a Hebrew letter: nun, gimmel, hay and shin.

Each letter has a specific meaning. Nun means nothmeans half, means put. The i. eanings can vary according to the particular game being played.

Players spin the dreidel and proceed according to which side the dreidel lands on. Usually, a pile of 'winnings' is being played for and the players each try for the biggest share of the winnings.
