Now that they will have to go to their conditions and meet their friends of disapproval for their unbecoming conduct, the Herald in its most unbecoming attempt to show over their backs by declaring the majority was disorganised. The whole fact is that the majority were courteous and inclined to a degree that fairly separated their friends outside the convention when they saw that the acts of kindness were not appreciated, and that the opposition would not under any circumstances serve from their pretension to defeat the objects of the convention.

THE CONGRESSIONAL CONVENTION AND ITS RESULTS.

The Congressional Convention that convened in this city on the 15th inst., after five days proceedings has adjourned. It adjourned without accomplishing the object for which it was called, and it goes upon the record as one of the most remarkable Democratic Conventions ever held in this State, or elsewhere, at least on our knowledge of it. It was known before the call to order how low the vote would stand, and during the entire session that vote was not materially changed. Mr. Schlicher entered the convention with near a two-thirds majority, and at no time did more than two or three of his delegates change their votes. Having so large a majority, it was unnecessary for them to be exposed to so long. They were entrusted to vote for him as long as he had a chance to secure the nomination, and while he remained so far ahead of his opponents, he certainly held the best chance to be selected as the nominee of the convention. The minority were so divided in their opposition to the majority, and that, too, when they saw demonstrated that they almost positively knew the case before they met in convention, that a large majority was opposed to their candidate, and that there was no hope for his nomination unless the majority in the most objectionable manner deserted the man of their choice. The minority were liberal and kind to the greatest degree, and offered the convention "Hobson's choice"—Judge Ireland or nobody. They proposed no compromise candidate, and continually twitted the majority concerning some "dark horse" they believed the latter were favorable to. They fought the resolution to make no nomination, in the hope of passing a resolution recommending both candidates to the people, and thereby giving their man an equal adjustment with his opponent by the convention, when the fact showed he would be elected only the underdog of a little more than one-third. Every trick known in convention was resorted to by the minority to prejudice the delegates and the people, by which they might reap advantage, and after patiently submitting to the indignities offered, and the annoyances caused by the unreasonable action of the minority, the majority, after fifty-three uneventful ballots, decided to adjourn the convention, and lay before the people the result of their deliberations.

Mr. Schlicher throughout the convention held a solidly large vote, and the endorsement, an endorsement almost equivalent to a nomination. That he did not receive the nomination was contrary to all the rules of president in conventions of any note or importance, contrary to reason, and contrary to justice. The people will well understand and recognize this fact, and we sincerely believe, at the polls next November, will give Mr. Schlicher such an overwhelming majority as will fittingly rebuke those who made this ridiculous effort to defeat the expressed will of a majority of the people of this district.

Judge Ireland will go before the people as a man fairly defeated, but master of circumstances under which he can sneak into the field and run the forlorn hope. He was rejected by a majority of the people through their delegates in convention; he goes to the people again begging them to reconsider their action, and with no basis for his plea.

Thus the convention ended, and thus the two men will go before the people. Mr. Schlicher and his friends are confident of an overwhelming victory. Judge Ireland knows that his political salvation depends upon his carrying the election.

THE PROPOSED COMMERCIAL CONVENTION AT NEW ORLEANS.

The commercial convention to be held at New Orleans, in Louisiana, will be one of the most important meetings held in the Southern States for years. It is a step in the right direction and one that should have been taken long ago. Grand results in commercial enterprise can only be accomplished by unity of action on the part of those interested, and from the interchange of views, the disagreements formed, and the combined and intelligently directed influence of the important elements to be centered in the proposed convention, the most beneficial results may confidently be expected. Many matters will be before the convention of the highest importance to the people of the Southwest especially, and we should have a full and able representation there. We are especially interested in the development of friendly and commercial relations with the Mexican and South American States, and in a Southern Pacific railway. The people of the southern part of Texas and Louisiana are deeply interested in having a Southern Pacific railway in fact as well as name, and should have influential delegates there to represent our claims and seek to give to that behalf the most influential support that cannot fail to carry in the bills of our national Congress, as well as throughout the country at large. The Convention is of the highest importance and we wish to every success in point of numbers present and the accomplishment of its purposes.

THE QUESTION OF RESUMPTION.

The bill to repeal the resumption act failed to pass, and Secretary Sherman is making arrangements to carry the act into operation at the date provided for—January 1st, 1876. The question of resumption is a subject of much discussion on the part of the leading papers and bankers throughout the country, and opinions are varied. Some declare resumption at the date named would be impracticable and disastrous to the best interests of the country, others are non-committal, or frankly acknowledge their inability to form an intelligent opinion, while others join with Secretary Sherman in the belief that it will not only be practicable to resume specie payments at the time provided for by law, but that resumption will have enormous and beneficial effects before the year expires.

When Secretary Sherman speaks to those the financial officers of New York and other cities into an "entire turmoil" to do his duties, and that the one for New York, where he looks around the sub-treasury building a few days, he has and manipulates the views of a few of the most prominent bankers, is an uncommittal and looks serious and mysterious, and then the country for days afterwards is flooded with views, opinions and speculations concerning the national finance and the subject of Sherman's visit. Sherman was in New York a few days ago, and the Sun of that city contributed the following to the financial literature of the day:
