From the London Daily News. Mad, Posh, September 12. The following particulars regarding the catastrophe of the town of Miskolc, in Hungary, will give some idea of the sudden and terrific effect of the storm.

The position of Miskolc is far from suggesting the chance of any catastrophic inundation, for though at the end of a valley, the opening is at least from two to three miles in width, and the small stream, which runs through the town, has its source only some ten miles away.

With reference to the far heavier visitation at Miskolc, a friend writing from the neighborhood thus describes the scene: "The Regenerator of Miskolc had telegraphed on Friday evening, 10th, that a heavy rain would fall at once. On leaving the railway station the first indications of the disaster were numerous persons who were seen to be running about in the streets, and on the other side of the road, but not until we got into the principal street did we see the awful extent of the damage."
