YELLOW FEVER NOTES. New Orleans, November 9. - Weather clear and cool. Yellow fever deaths, four for the twenty-four hours ending at 12 M.

Within the last 24 hours in response to the circular of the Board of Health, Physicians have reported 1,500 cases of fever, but not heretofore reported. Major W. H. Beall, chief of the Board of Health, who is now confined to his bed, reports that the number of the Howard during the epidemic of 1878, expressed the opinion that there have been during the last few days a moderate yellow fever in New Orleans and vicinity. The Howard Association Physicians did not report to board of health.

Vicksburg, Nov. 9. - No fever deaths in the city and county and no new deaths reported.

Washington, November 9. - The Surgeon-General's abstract of the sanitary reports for the week show that the fever has comparatively disappeared where having been but eleven new cases at New Orleans, thirty-five at Mobile, 3 at Chattanooga with thirty-three deaths at Memphis.

COTTON CROP STATISTICS. New Orleans, November 9. - New Orleans Department of the National Cotton Exchange crop report for October: Louisiana - thirteen reports on the following parishes: Concordia, East Baton Rouge, Livingston, Rapides, St. Martin, St. Landry, St. Helena, St. Joseph, and West Feliciana, average 24,000 bales. The remainder of the State reported by all correspondents as very favorable for gathering the crop and much better than anticipated. The average of the crop in every parish between the 10th and 20th, but no damage has been reported. In the above parishes about three-fourths of the crop has been picked, and picking will be finished about the 20th and 1st. The yield is good and larger than last year.

Mississippi - forty replies from 22 counties.
