The railroads of the country, according to recent reports made, did a much more profitable business the past year than for several years before. The number of miles of new road built was greater during the past year than during the previous year. The following shows the number of miles of railroad built in the United States for each year since 1871: 1872, 6,550; 1873, 3,456; 1874, 1,731; 1875, 1,476; 1876, 2,173; 1877, 1,964; 1878, to December 10, 2,226.

Venezuela has for a long time been greatly excited about her iron mines, the enterprise of the institution being its great resource, but now a perplexing question arises concerning the resources. The treasurer elected having failed to qualify, the governor declares the State has no treasurer at all. Some may think, however, that if there is no treasurer, a treasurer would be a superfluous and expensive official.

Some of the Kansas newspapers, especially those in the western counties, are still demanding a re-adjustment of the "dead line." A strong effort will be made to secure that result in the Legislature this winter, with a strong probability of success. The relocating of the dead line further west would prove a considerable annoyance to Texas cattle drivers, and it is our duty to oppose the effort to make the change.

The Ohio State grange claims 777 granges with a membership of 40,000, but we conclude there is not much enthusiasm manifested concerning it among its members from the fact that at a recent meeting of the State Grange at Columbus but one hundred delegates were present, representing only sixty-seven counties.

It is said Edison has at last put down to a rough estimate of the cost of making electric light by his method. He positively asserts that he can make six hundred lights for twelve hours, for \$25.00, whereas with gas in New York it costs \$65. He says a one-horse power will make more than six lights, each equal to a gas jet.

Governor Major Roberts, it is said, has expressed a determination to run the machine to suit himself after his inauguration, and self-constituted advisers of the Chief Executive are expected to make a note on it.
