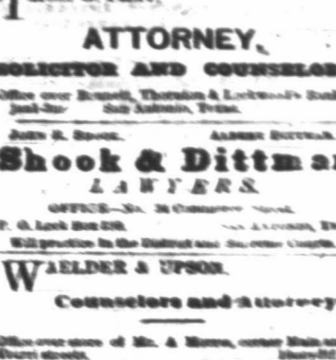

THE TEMPEST IN THE TEAPOT.

What Came From the Republican Central Club Meeting Last Night.

The central republican club which took a recess from its meeting Wednesday, until 7 o'clock last evening, assembled at the reporter's office, Judge Wesley Ogden, president of the club, in the chair. "Our reporter," upon reaching the place of meeting, attempted an entrance through the front door of the second story, to the court room, but found it locked.
