cent can be deposited in any postal money.

When the sum deposited reaches 24s, on the ap-plication of the depositor, the pastmaster shall issue a postal order true, payable on demand in currency, and to be receivable in exchange for postal saving bonds of the Uni-ted States.

The bill further provides for the isaue of postal savings bonds of the denomination of \$10 and the multiple thereof, to be sold for currency, and to bear interest at the rate of 4 per cent per annum. All money to be received in exchange for these bonds is to be applied to the redemption of such bonds of the United States as are redeemable at the pleasure of the government.
