The stubble immediately sends up new shoots, more numerous than the original ones, and thus the érop increases with onch successive cutting. As many as four cuttings may be made during the year and Peter Henderson, the celebrated gardener of New York, says that twenty tons of dried fodder may thus be obtained from a single acre. But, as we before suggested, let us divide this amount by two or four and the amount produced may well satisfy the most exacting.


