The comptroller in his report of 1872 said the constitution of the United States provides that no state shall emit bills of credit, and it has been held by the supreme court of the United States in the famous case of Briscoe vs. Burk, of Kentucky, that a note of circulation issued by a state involving the tath of the state and designed to circulate as meany on the smedit of the state in ordinary course of business, is a bill of credit. Other decisions of the supreme court held that certificates issued by a state in sums not exceeding ten dollars nor less than fifty cents are receivable in payment of taxes. The fact that the credit of a state being good for their redemption are bills of credit within the prohibition of the constitution.

Out of this predigious treasure, the gift of a single benefactor, there has been spent close upon \$2,750,000, but in return the trustees have acquired a goodly accumulation of remunerative property in land and houses. So far, there have been provided for the benefit of the artisans and the laboring poor of Loadon more than 5,000 rooms, exclusive of baths and washhouses. The fund is in a prosperous condition, the net profits of the year being nearly \$110,000. The report coacludes with the statement that the death rate in the Peabody buildings during the three years ending December 31, 1878, was 20,76 per thousand, being 1.80 in a thousand below the average of the entire metropolis during the same period. The magnificence of Mr. Peabody's gift has always inspired admiration for his act and esteem for his memory, but there is nothing emotional or sentimental about it. Mr. Peabody was an extremely shrewd man of business, who, during a long course of years, was fain to subordinate his generous impulses to the exigencies of money-making. He acquired a vast fortune, principally by judicious speculations in government bonds at a very critical moment in the history of this country, and at length found himself in a position where he was able to do much good with the ample means at his disposal. He desired to aid, not the lame, the halt or the bilind; not the sick or the destitute; not the widow and the orphan; but the industrious poor of Londom—a noble purpose, which has been wisely carried out by Lord Derby and his fellow trustees.
