Stratford, Oat., May 5—The Grand Trunk raffway freight sheds were blown up the ex-plosion of nitro-glycerine to-day. Several men were killed and 150 cars destroyed. broken or blown in, and even side walks, upon which people were walking weere shaken so as to cause the pedestrians to fall. The causes were soon made apparent. A car laden with dynamite had exploded at the Grand Trunk freight-yard. The wreck made by the explosion beggass description. Undernesth the dynamite car a hole several feet deep had been scooped out, and the end of the brick freight shed and the protections of its roof were blown down. Beveral frame buildings were leveled to the ground and long lines of freight cars lying in the yard were utterly wrecked. The business part of the town is nearly a mile from the scene of the explosition, but it shared in the disaster. Valuble glass windows were broken in their frames, and the damage to property is esti-

Value glass windows were proxen in their frames, and the damage to property is estimated at many thousands of dollars. Two railroad employees were working in the yard, Frank Lemon of Montreal and Thos. Donlon of Stratford. They were blown into fragments, the foot of one of them being found 200 yards off. Others were injured, but the whole extent of the disester cannot be known

whole extent of the diseaser cannot be known for some time yet.

Stratford, Ont., May 5.—The damage by the explosion is much greater than was expected. The houses around the freight shed were nearly all wooden building and several were blown into minute fragments.
