THE NEGRO EXODUS

Vicksburg, Miss., May 6.—The Mississippi valley labor convention reassembled this morning with an increased attendance. The committee on resolutions submitted the fol-

have given rise to the present exodus or our colored population, as far as possible within the limited time allowed, and while these causes are difficult to ascertain owing to exceptional cases of all kinds brought to their attention, they believe the following to include those which may be considered proximate: The low price of cotton and partial failure of the crop of the first year; the irrational system of planting adopted in some sections whereby labor was deprived of the intelligence to direct and the presence of economy to make it profitable; a vicious system of credit fostered by laws permitting laborers and tenants to mortgage crops before they were grown or even planted; apprehensions on the part of many colored people produced by insidious reports circulated among them that their, civil and political rights are endangered or likely to be; hurtful and false rumors diligently disseminated that by emigration to Kansas the colored people would obtain land, mules and money from the government, without cost to themselves, and become independent farmers; and many retail country store-keepers engaging in the business of selling whiskey to laborers and tenants, whereby their morals have been corrupted, their labor rendered insufficient and the pleasant relations between them and their landlors and employers destroyed. It is a matter of astonishment to your committee that the colored people could be induced to credit the idle stories circulated of a promised land where their wants could be supplied and their independence secured without exertions on their part. It was going to the extent of ignorance and credulity to credit them, and yet evidence of an undoubted character was furnished your committee as to this matter. It is one of the factors in the movement and which we cannot now forceast. There are in the state of Mississippi alone 5,500 acres of land belonging to

to this matter. It is one of the factors in the movement and which we cannot now forecast. There are in the state of Mississippi alone 5,500 acres of land belonging to the United States now subject to homestead entries, and thrifty colored men in the south can pre-empt 160 acres of this land at the moderate cost of about \$180. Land in Kansas cannot be acquired for less. In no part of the civilized world can unskilled labor secure larger returns by homest toil than among us; but idleness accompanied by extravagance produces suffering and want here and elsewhere.

Your committee believe that the legislaton of our state should be shaped so as to foster habits of industry among the colored people, elevate the standard of social morals and improve and preserve our common school system. Diverse views have been expressed by parties equally desirous of reaching some conclusion, viz., to ascertain the grievances and apply as far as can be done by us proper redress, but this could only be done with a full knowledge of all the facts. That errors have been committed by whites and blacks alike, as each in turn have controlled the government of the states here represented, may be admitted. Disregarding the past and burying its dead with it, and standing upon the living present and looking hopefully to the future which is before us, your committee think their duty accomplished when they have adopted and reported

us, your committee think their duty accomplished when they have adopted and reported these resolutions.

Resolved, That the interests of planters, laborers, landlords and tenants are identical; that they must prosper and suffer together; that it is the duty of the planters and landlords of the states here represented to devise some contract system with laborers and tenants by which both parties will receive the full benefit of their labor, governed by intelligence and economy.

Resolved, That this convention does affirm that the colored race has been placed by the constitution of the United States, and the laws of the states here represented, on a plane of absolute legal equality with the white race, and does declare that the colored race shall be accorded the practical enjoyment of all the rights, civil or political, guaranteed by the said constitution and laws. Resolved, That to this end the members of this convention pledge themselves to use whatever power and influence they possess to project the colored race against all dangers in respect to fair expressions of their

freedom in the exercise of the rights of citizenship.

Resolved, That the unrestricted credit system pervading the states represented, based upon liens or mortgages, or stock and crops to be grown in the future, followed by short crops, has provoked distrust and created unrest, and disturbed the entire laboring population, and all laws authorizing tiens on crops for advances constituted of articles of prime necessity at moderate profits, whether such advances are made by landlord, planter or merchat, should be dis-

report to the civil authorities all persons disseminating such reports.

Resolved, That it is the constitutional right of the colored people to emigrate where they please, or to whatever state they may select for residence, but this convention urges them to proceed in their movements towards singuistion as reasonable human beings, provicing in advasce by sconomy the means for the speciation and settlement; sustaining their reputations for honesty and fair dealing by preserving intact until full completion the contracts for labor and leasing which have already been made. If when they have done this they still desire to leave, all obstacles to their departure will be removed, and all practicable assistance will be afforded them and their places will be supplied with other contented labor.

Your committee believe that if the views expressed in the foregoing resolution are practically carried out by the people of both saces in good faith, the disquist of our people will subside. We appeal to the people of both races in the states here represented to aid us in carrying these resolutions into effect, and to report to the authorities all violations of laws and all interference with private rights.
