THE GOVERNOR'S VETO IN THE LIGHT OF THE FIGURES

Deeply impressed with the conviction that the governor's veto of the appropriation for public schools and for the interest and sinking fund of the state debt, will work injury to the best interests of the state in many ways, the Express has looked carefully but, so far, in vain for some vindication more satisfactory than appears in the message of the ill-fated executive.

If any doubt could be felt as to the absence of any necessity for the veto, it should be dispelled by the elaborate and conclusive letter of Hon. Geo. F. Finlay of Galveston, published in the Galveston News of the 10th inst., and reproduced in the Express on the 11th. As our readers have seen this very able letter for themselves, we will not recapitulate its statements nor repeat its arguments. It is sufficient to say that in what the distinguished writer well terms "this most unfortunate disagreement" it is made apparent very clearly by a simple array of figures that the governor is wrong and that the majority of the legislature is right.

RENEWING RELATIONS WITH MEXICO

A London dispatch states that there is a probability that diplomatic relations will be resumed between England and Mexico. After the execution of Maximilian, England, France, Germany and Austria refused to continue their relations with Mexico and finally withdrew their soldiers and consular representatives, and all the records of their respective legations. These nations regarded Mexico as having "plunged herself without the aid of civilized governments by the killing of the unfortunate emperor after his surrender at Queretaro. With in a few years, however, Germany re-established her relations, and the United States has since then made overtures to England to induce the latter to do likewise, but that England refused to do so.
