REMARKS WANTS MORE TROOPS.

If the Berlin dispatch of the 7th inst. to the Daily Express is to be believed, Bismarck wants more soldiers. What he wants them for is a question that is likely to agitate the cabinets of Europe no little. The alleged cause is the increase of the military establishments of France and Russia. There is no irreconcilable conflict between Germany and Russia—none at least that is visible or immediate. But as to France the case is different. France has been recuperating her energies and resources since the great disaster which overwhelmed her in 1870, and has wisely kept aloof from all continental wars with all her neighbors. Her policy has been to remain peacefully neutral, and to work of reparation has been conscientiously pushed abroad, and vigorous renovation of the body politic in its every vital function has been the main object of the new republic and the people. The civil and military administrations have been remodelled and reformed, and efficiency has been the aim and watchword of all Frenchmen since the terrible awakening which followed the fall of Sedan. The picture now presented by France is one that would excite the admiration of the world. Within less than a decade she has risen from her ashes—a small realization of the idea of the fabled Phoenix—and in every essential element of a great nation is more prosperous and powerful now than she was on the day on which the Emperor Louis Napoleon issued his stirring call to arms nine years ago. But if there are any who imagine that France has no future designs looking to the recovery of Alsace and Lorraine, and to a rehabilitation of her proud position and influence among the nations of Europe, Bismarck is not of the number who so think. That active man of blood and iron reads the designs of men and of governments with a precision that is one of the most remarkable traits of a remarkable character. He well knows that France hides her time. It is very well to use the Russian increase of armament as a pretext in connection with the French military preparations. But just now it is probable that the Russian government has more thought of nihilism and of protecting itself from the many-headed monster threatening its existence from all sides, than of aggressive movements against any other power, and least of all against Germany. The prince chancellor has his eye on France, and if the German army is increased it will not be from any fear of trouble with Russia.

THE NEW ORLEANS PHOENIX

The New Orleans Phoenix has been looking into figures to see who is willing to pay the state debt and who is not, and finds that the majority of the committee which recommends repudiation represents only about one-fourth of the taxable property of Louisiana, while the minority recommending payment in full represents three-fourths of the property taxed. "In other words," says the Phoenix, "the man who will have the most to pay is the most willing to pay."

THE EXTRA SESSION

The legislature of the state will be convened in extra session this morning, and it is interesting to conjecture what will be the result of the following session. The constitution requires that the legislature shall provide for the maintenance of the public schools, and this, by reason of the governor's veto, was not done at the late regular session. For the same reason no provision was made for meeting the interest on the public debt. The governor convenes the legislature in special session to attend to this limited duty, and to consider other propositions to be submitted. The constitution provides that the special session shall not exceed thirty days, yet the governor has given notice of at least three or four different dates as he desires should be called on, besides there he may proceed from time to time during the session.

TO SAY NOTHING ABOUT THE TWO IMPORTANT MATTERS

To say nothing about the two important matters rendering the special session necessary, the proposed act for a change in the judiciary alone would doubtless consume two weeks of the time allowed for the session. The only general amendment during the first three weeks of the last regular session was the bill appropriating money to pay the millage and millage per diem, and it would be almost impossible to select from the governor's list of articles any five that the legislature would discuss in the time allowed them, unless they either pass or defeat them without due consideration of their merits. The only way in which the business proposed could be disposed of would be to follow the old Roman practice of leaving articles and having them registered, or, rather, by the legislature. If the governor have all the bills he wants passed, proposed, postponed, and the legislature would adopt or pass them without discussion or delay of any kind, that body might ac-
