

The Wonders of their Hair-Bressing The Old Maids, Buddhist Nuss.

A Canton (China) letter writer says: I never could find out precisely what is the great joy of a Chinese woman's life, but I think it since you are not seen to the control of the hair, and, truly, this is done with an claborate, artistic section of corrivon to see. The hair dressing is the one accomplishment of the Chinese ladies, occupying the same place that music and drawing nave in the chrostic of our own women. Their hair is invariably black and very long. It is drawn back tightly from the face and stiffened with a gam made from some kind of word. It is piled up in a wenderful pyramid of bows, loops, wings, twists, leaves, flowers, rolls, all so stiff that they sind alone without the aid of pads, roulettes, paffs or hair pins. Not a single hair is astray, the whole being highly polished, or, I should say, reneered, which keeps it smooth for nearly a week, when the fabric is taken down and remeded. They have a small leather pillow, which life undergreath the back of the neck and keeps the hoad in a settled position. Others have a case or box in which they put the whole head comfortably, and which prefered to the cofferer from being disordered. Upon the subject of tightening wagon dires a farmer says, Procure a number of small pieces of leather, from an inch and a half two Inches in diameter; with a sharp laife and compasses, or with a cutting punch, make round holes in the centre of these pieces, and make a straight out from holes to the outer edges of the piece, so as to form open rings. The holes must be made of asins that will nicely fit the tenous on the outer ands of the spokes. Place a fulcrum on the top of a hub, on which place your laver, with its short end under the felice, near a spoke, have an assistant bear down on the other end sufficiently to raise the felice, and expose the shoulder and tenon of the spoke, open your leather and fit it nicely around the isnon, holding it to its place while your assistant relaxes the lever, and atties the felices firmly upon the lever by a how or two upon the tire.
