From a private letter written by Mr. S. W. Kinsland, dated Houston, Texas, May 25, 1879. The agency of the Rio Grande river, La Plata county, Col., May 1, and received in this city by Mr. S. W. Kinsland, we are permitted to publish the following description of an Indian man.

At the risk of being you I will describe an Indian man who was captured by the late Rock Island and driven him from the support of the Rio Grande. Learning from the late Mr. J. H. Kinsland, of the Rio Grande and Capote lands of the Indians, that they were going to run their horses against the Waimanacua of the same tribe, I accepted their invitation and rode out to meet them.

The track of the horse was a straight stretch, and yet everything was conducted with the order and decorum of a Quaker meeting. The track is a straight stretch of the same old head man of the same tribe, and he himself upon the ground in a steady race from the quarter to the quarter.

It is early morning and man and woman come with baskets of clay on their backs, and little hatchets to gash the trees. Where white men drive their teams, the gash they stick their oars on the trunk with their hands, so as to catch the whole flow of the river in a large one, four or five gashes may be cut in a row, and the water will run through them.

Our man's horse has brought in his day's panning—a calash of the white liquid, in appearance resembling the white liquid in this condition is completely white and forms an inferior quality of gum. It is made by the Indians by a process of manufacture, for which our guide has been preparing. Over the smoldering fire, fed with the hard wood of the cottonwood, he places a kind of clay chimney, which is a wide-mouthed, bottomless jug, through which the smoke pours in a constant stream.

Now he takes his horse and the wooden wheel, like a round-bottomed paddle-boat, with milk and holds it over the fire. The smoke from the chimney goes into the wheel, and the whole is heated.
