THE SALE OF THE INTERNATIONAL.

The long looked for sale of the International and Great Northern railroad took place at Austin on Thursday last, as reported in our dispatches. As the present president of the road, Mr. Moore, is reported as one of the purchasers, there will be no change in the management, though the programme of those interested in the sale has not been made known. However, the arrangement for the sale was carried out as agreed upon among the bondholders can safely be inferred from the price paid for the road.

The sale of this road is a matter of the greatest importance to the people of San Antonio and western Texas. It is of the greatest importance to the owners of the road to extend their line from Austin as far as this city at least, but heretofore their hands have been tied through the heavy bonded debt on their road and lands. This sale will relieve the road and lands, and place the company in a position to make the extension so much desired. The extension of the line to this city will carry the road through one of the richest and most fertile portions of the state, where a local business now awaits them, and will also give it a share of the great freight and passenger traffic of western Texas, which now escapes it. There will doubtless be a reorganization of the company and a readjustment of its affairs, which will require a few months time, and then the work of extension will be commenced, as at all times past it has been to the company. From all we can learn of the objects and intentions of those who now own the road, we feel safe in predicting that the International will reach this city at least by the first of January 1881.

The great value of this proposed extension to western Texas can scarcely be estimated at a too high figure. The people of San Antonio will find a competition that will cause a heavy reduction in railroad freight and passenger rates, and immense traffic of lands in Frio, Zavala, Dimmitt, Webb and other counties in southwestern Texas belonging to the International, and not heretofore considered on the market will not only be placed upon sale, but will have a powerful corporation to advertise its advantages and work to secure purchasers. The company will have a double interest in securing purchasers for these lands, as they will be able to realize money from their sale, as well as to secure a country tributary to their road, and consequently to increase their business. Heretofore the International efforts of this company have been directed toward settling the country along its line, but with the release of their lands from their mortgage obligation, the company will strive to sell its own property instead of that of others. Every influential and energetic investor brought into western Texas is just the much needed addition to the wealth of the country and consequent assistance in building up the trade of San Antonio, and with the promise of great efforts in this direction, and of much cheaper freight rates, furnished by this sale and unravelling of the complex lines surrounding the International, the people of this city and section have good cause for congratulation.

Do not get scared. We do not think our people should feel any alarm on account of the report that cholera is prevailing in Monterey. There is no foundation for such a report. Our merchants and other citizens are in constant communication with the people of Monterey, some of our people have relatives living there, and if cholera or any other epidemic prevailed there to even half or one-quarter the extent reported there, the news certainly would be sent here, by the earliest possible conveyance after the disease commenced its ravages. This is the reasonable way to take of the case, and therefore any excitement over the report mentioned is unnecessary.

Besides the reasons given above, we have the additional encouraging assurance that this is not a "cholera year." Cholera epidemics visit us with intervals of not less than sixteen years, according to the experience of more than half a century past at least, and therefore, as the last epidemic occurred in 1866, another will not be due for three or four years yet. Again, we believe the course of cholera is from east to west, and if it looks out in Monterey, it would have to circumnavigate the globe to get to San Antonio. However, we do not accept the latter hypothesis so fully that we would be entirely free from alarm should the epidemic prevail in Monterey as reported.
