

We, the undersigned physicians, having been invited to a meeting at the mayor's office, August 23, 1879, convened to adopt measures to prevent the spreading of small-pox, respectfully submit the following suggestions and opinions:

1. We consider the actual number of small-pox patients in our city as very small, in proportion to the number of inhabitants (one case in 1800) and much smaller than

in proportion to the number of inhabitants (one case in 1800) and much smaller than during the epidemics of 1863 and 1849.

2. We believe that the city authorities have acted promptly and according to established principles of sanitary law, in all cases of small-pox, which were under their entire control, that is, which occurred amongst paupers, and such negroes and Mexicans who were willing to submit to rules for the enforcement of which no law exists, for instance, removal to pest houses.

3. We believe that the city government cannot be held responsible for the consequences of criminal concealment of smalling pox patients in families over whom it had no control, which concealment has undoubtedly contributed to the spread of this disease, as well as to the panic created in the public, because it was erroneously believed that the number of concealed cases were much larger than it actually is.

4. We suggest the strict enforcement of the law regarding small pox and would trecommend heavy fines, when such cases are knowingly concealed, either by families or physicians. They also urged the enforcement of strict rules to prevent a further spread of the malady.
