—There was a general fire department trial in Alamo plaza last evening. The test of the fire hydrants were very satisfactory.

The report of the expert is expected soon, and we may expect the opinion of the experts to be the same. Mr. Dugnity informs our reporter that he is now paying as much as \$12 per acre for field grain, and that the dishonest farmer is making a profit of \$100 to \$120 an acre.
